lthough opportunities for campaign Tappearances had slowed in late June and early July, a big opportunity presented itself on the weekend of June 26-27.

Outright Libertarians of San Francisco went all "out" in organizing events for LP Presidential candidate Michael Badnarik's appearance at the San Francisco Pride festival and parade. We candidates were thrilled-being handed a well-or-

ganized appearance with an audience of thousands is a rare treat—as were Outright Libertarians. They were happy to do all the hard work, since Libertarian candidates from all over the Bay Area showed up with bells on to express their support for the civil liberties of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgendered people.

On Saturday, I spent the day helping out at Outright Libertarians' Operation Politically Homeless booth. Not surprisingly, almost all the passersby who took the World's Smallest Political Quiz at the S.F. Pride Festival scored libertarian or liberal. There weren't many Bush fans around. We had quite a few pleasant, interesting conversations. I had expected to meet a lot of people from Senate District 13, but was surprised that most of the people we talked to were from out of state.

On Sunday, we had a substantial parade contingent. Two convertibles: one for Mr.

■ Message from the Chair

This Time It's Possible

My brother David's favorite social commentary is how parents and other people "spend the first two or three years of your life telling you how to walk and talk, and the rest of it telling you to sit down and shut up."

For most of my younger years, it seemed everyone was telling me, "Anything's possible!" and, "You can do anything you set your mind to!" Usually, I'm certain, they were just giving me that good old American Can—Do thing; and yes, I'm sure that sometimes they were trying to encourage me personally to meet what they saw as my potential.

But the talk has turned. Now, people are too quick, and sometimes it seems too happy, to tell me that everything is impossible. What? Retire with a million dollars? Not in this economy! What, live like a free person and make your own choices? Not with the USA PATRIOT Act and today's courts, you don't! And my new personal favorite, "What?! Get a Libertarian elected to serious office?"

Libertarians used to laughingly apologize by saying, "There's something in our platform to offend everybody." I suppose that's true, from a negative perspective. But the reverse is also true: there's something in our platform to gratify everybody.

We have all of the political good—fiscal responsibility, individual liberty, personal and political responsibility—so we do have a reason for everyone to vote for us. The only reason it doesn't happen is that we don't show people how it works.

I recently walked up my street greeting a few neighbors who were home on a Friday afternoon. I asked each a single question: "What's disturbing you most today?" It didn't matter what any of them said: there was a direct way to quickly show that government is part if not parcel of the cause of that bother, and that the Libertarian Party's platform offers a constructive solution. And to every doubtful response or challenge, I found that a single rebuttal worked nicely and gained respect: "Yes,

of course all of our positions require people to take a lot more responsibility than everyone else has told them to take, but if they did, just think what the world would be." Every one of those neighbors went away thoughtful. I didn't bother to try to close the sale, that will happen later when I'm not merely experimenting.

So what's it to be? Stay on the defensive, always apologizing for perceived downsides in the best political and social solution on the

planet? Or begin to celebrate and tell people the good news?

It's about goals. Some are defensive, yes, but others must be proactive.

Judge James Gray's U.S. Senate campaign slogan is, "This time it

matters!" And he's right. That's the defensive half. I've proposed that, at least in California where we're teaming up with his campaign, the Badnarik for President slogan should be, "This time it's possible!" Judge Gray's staff liked the idea so much that they're already billing the August co—tour as the "This time it matters; this time it's possible" tour.

How is it possible that Badnarik could be elected to the presidency? Gee, how was it possible that he even became our nominee? Nothing short of ordinary magic, I suppose. So what's the magic that could carry him all the way, and many of our local candidates with him?

We have something for everybody; more than one something for many; and many somethings for a lot of people. For many groups we are their *only* representatives, and lots of people are in more than one such group. When you add it all up, the magical math is that we have well over 200% of the vote!

All we have to do is make it real.

Give us your time as volunteers, and your money as donors to the party and contributors to the candidates, and we will show you the magic. Because: *This time it matters. This time it's possible.*

Before experiencing the color and bawdiness of the San Francisco Pride festival, the LP's eloquent spokesman and Presidential candidate, Michael Badnarik, enjoyed the color of the Palomares Canyon as he spoke with supporters in Castro Valley on June 25.

Westover Vineyards, thanks to the generosity of its libertarian proprietor Bill Smyth, was the setting for this elegant fund raiser at dusk.

Organized by LP of the East Bay, the evening featured about a dozen Bay Area candidates, who shared their campaign strategies and news. Allen Hacker, the California Coor-

dinator of the Badnarik for President campaign, kicked off the weekend of fund raising with a successful pitch to the crowd of 70 or so supporters. Terry Floyd, treasurer of East Bay LP remarked that as Mr. Badnarik's Bay Area weekend progressed, Hacker employed a different fund raising appeal at each event. Including ticket sales, this evening's event cleared several thousand dollars for the campaign.



- Reading newspaper accounts and forwarding relevant information to campaigns; and
- Organize coffees and invite candidates to speak.

Badnarik, one bearing four local Libertarian candidates, including Zander Collier, running for State Assembly, District 24, and me, more local candidates walking, including Allen Rice, running for State Senate, District 11, San Francisco Libertarians carrying banners and signs, Sandy Pierre defying gravity by carrying a torch and portraying the Statue of Liberty, and Starchild, candidate for San Francisco School Board, resplendent in a bright two-piece bikini, rollerskating alongside us and very efficiently handing out "Badnarik for President" flyers. It was a blast waving to mile after mile of parade-goers. At every point along the way, there was at least one Libertarian Party fan in the crowd, and Collier and I worked on revving up every single one of them.

That weekend I realized there is great potential in having all of the regional Libertarian Party organizations in the Bay Area to work together on outreach projects designed for our shared liberal political environment. Marketing libertarianism to voters in the Bay Area is very different from marketing libertarianism to those in, say, Orange County.

In other campaign news, my time in the past few weeks has been dedicated to setting up campaign infrastructure. I've established the "Mike Laursen for California Senate" campaign committee, so that the campaign can accept your contributions and spend credible amounts of money. I created PDF contribution and endorsement forms for Zander Collier's and my campaigns, and used my web programing skills to add a campaign news mailing list, and credit card and PayPal payment options to my web site. The on–line payment pages can be also set up on other candidates' web sites with a few minutes of modification.

Then on Wednesday, July 14, the Gray campaign held an outreach event at Rosie McCann's Irish Pub at San Jose's Santana Row shopping center. Where else but America, and especially Silicon Valley, would we find Iranian–Americans as proprietors of an Irish pub?

Judge Gray's emphasis at this gathering was,

not surprisingly, "the USA PATRIOT Act must go." Gray points out that the Act creates a broad definition of domestic terrorism

that chills free expression and association. It allows non-citizens to be detained without charge; crushes the right to privacy; and removes much judicial review over intelligence activities.
