The state affiliates of the Libertarian Party listed below hereby form a representative region for the purpose of electing the number of members and alternates of the Libertarian National Committee that are allocated by the Libertarian Party bylaws to the region based on the number of national party sustaining members associated with the region.

To facilitate the gathering of signatures, signatures may appear on separate versions of this agreement. All versions together shall constitute the agreement.

A regional caucus shall be held at each regular national convention. Each registered National Convention delegate of states party to this agreement who are present at the caucus shall have one vote. If there is more than one nominee for any office, voting shall be by ballot.

This agreement shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of the national Libertarian Party a number of versions of this agreement signed by states with enough national party sustaining members to form a representative region. After this agreement has come into effect and before nominations have been opened at the regional caucus, a state affiliate may join or withdraw from this agreement with the written consent of a majority of the other state affiliates party to this agreement if the bylaws of the national Libertarian party so permit. Once nominations have opened, a state affiliate may join or withdraw from this agreement with the written consent of all other state affiliates party to this agreement if the bylaws of the national Libertarian party so permit.

Any state which is party to this agreement may leave the region at any time, according to that state's bylaws, rules, constitution, and state law. No states may be admitted or readmitted to the region outside of the regional alignment window in the national party bylaws.

Terms of office

The term of office for a regional representative or alternate shall commence at the close of the convention at which a representative region may be formed and shall end at the close of the next convention at which a representative region may be formed.

Qualifications to serve as regional representative or alternate regional representative

- Regional representatives and alternate regional representatives must be members in good standing of the National Party and of their respective state party.
- Regional representatives and alternate representatives must be residents of states which are members of this region.
- No state within this region may have more than one regional representative and one alternate regional representative. This rule is inapplicable in the event that a regional representative is removed, steps down, or retires.
- 4. Once the elections have been completed, a person elected as a regional representative member or alternate of the LNC may be removed from office by:
 - 4.1. a vote of the majority of the region's registered national convention delegates at a regional caucus, or
 - 4.2. the signature of sixty percent (60%) of the state chairs in the region who are both a) a majority of the state chairs in the region and b) chair states which hold at least 60% national party sustaining members in the region as determined for the formation of this region.
- A vacancy may be filled by:
 - 5.1. a vote of the region's registered national convention delegates at a regional caucus, or
 - 5.2. a majority of the state chairs in the region without regard to the number of sustaining members in each state. Any vacancy amount Representatives or Alternates will be filled by election by the State Chairs. There is no automatic ascension of Alternates to Representatives.

DUTIES AND EXPECTATIONS FOR REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVES

- The elected representatives will sign off on this agreement indicating their agreement with these duties and expectations:
 - a. Diligently represent and advocate for the interests of the regional states in their votes, debate, and participation in the business of the Libertarian National Committee;
 - Make a good faith effort to confer with each of the state chairs prior to votes of significant import;
 - Upon notification by a state chair that they believe a proposed action by the LNC to be significant, the regional representative(s) will solicit opinions of the chairs (including votes of the chairs in any polling deemed necessary by the regional representatives).
 - ii. No directives of the chairs will be binding on regional representatives, save that directive is approved by 60% of the state chairs.
 - provide regular updates to regional members (i.e. website, social media groups, electronic newsletter, regional conference calls);
 - i. pass on any regional contact information obtained to the successor representatives;
 - d. provide both a telephone number and email address for members to contact the representatives and be reasonably available to speak with same;
 - e. make a good faith effort to confer with each of the regional chairs prior to the production of a regional report for submission to the Libertarian National Committee;
 - f. timely produce and submit comprehensive reports to the Libertarian National Committee;
 - g. make a good faith effort to attend at least one convention in each of the regional states per term;
 - the regional alternate is expected to fully participate in all proceedings, including attendance at LNC meetings, and to assist the Regional Representative as needed, including a regular report of their activities to be included in the regional report(s).
 - i. Any state may withdraw from participation in the region, upon written notice of that state Chair, at any time. That state may not re-enter the region until the next convention cycle.
