Motion: implement rotating Chairs as follows:

1. Each member shall serve a term of seven months, with the exception of the last term, which shall be for six months.
2. At the conclusion of a Committee-member's seven-month term as Chair, that member will be deemed to have vacated the Chair position, but not membership on the Committee.
3. Between 15 and 30 days prior to the expiration of a Chair's term, the Committee will name a Chair for the succeeding term by the following method: one member may pick or defer to serve a term in order of a randomized selection process. That randomized selection process resulted in the following picking order: [2. Stratton; 3. Montoni; 4. Krawchuk; 5. Kinsella; 6. Seebeck; 7. Tarnoff] If no member picks to serve as Chair for that seven-month term, the Chair position shall be automatically filled in the descending picking order ( $\qquad$ ).
a. First example: From December 2, 2022 and December 17, 2022, prior to the seven-month Judicial Committee term beginning January 1st, 2023, Committee members may pick or defer whether to serve as Chair during Term B. Assume that
$\qquad$ has served as Chair during Term A. Assume further that
$\qquad$ , $\qquad$ , $\qquad$ , and $\qquad$ defer. $\qquad$ would then serve as Chair for
Term B (unless $\qquad$ also deferred or remained silent, in which case $\qquad$ would serve as Chair for Term B).
4. Once a member has served a seven-month term as Chair, that member becomes ineligible to serve another seven-month term as Chair, except in the case of an unfilled vacancy on the Committee and by a majority vote of its remaining members.
5. The members of this Committee may vote to dissolve this rotating Chair arrangement by a majority vote.
