Warn Your Friends: "Don't Waste Your Vote!"

A message from Joe Dehn, County Chair:

Every four years we hear the advice about voting for president -- **don't waste your vote!** What does this really mean?

The starting point in answering this question has to be: What is your vote for? Is its main purpose to say which candidate you prefer? Is it to help decide who gets elected? Is it to "send a message" in favor of a particular viewpoint, or in opposition to the current political system?



As I see it, for anybody living here in California, the answer is the same *regardless* of which of those considerations is most important to you: **The only way to NOT waste your vote is to vote Libertarian!**

- If what you most want to do with your vote is express support for a candidate, the choice is obvious. Jo Jorgensen and Spike Cohen are the best candidates both in terms of personal integrity and on issues that matter to Libertarians by far. Trump and Biden each have so many negatives both on issues and with respect to personal behavior that even many voters in their own parties aren't happy about voting for them.
- If what you most want to do with your vote is help keep one of the front-runners out of the White House the answer is that you can't. Your vote in California is going to make no difference in that. Biden is going to get all 55 of California's electoral votes. A vote for Trump to help stop Biden would be a waste because Trump can't possibly win California (unless there is a massive shift in favor of Trump nationwide, in which case California's electoral votes won't matter). A vote for Biden to help stop Trump would be wasted because he's already got enough votes to win California. So no matter which of those candidates you might hope to be "less evil", voting for either of them would be wasting your vote.
- What if a voter's primary interest is sending a message, a message about what kind of changes they want to see? Again, the choice is clear: Vote Libertarian!
 The Libertarian Party and its candidates are the only voice in the electoral system consistently advocating both personal and economic freedom.
- What if someone just wants to cast a "protest vote", to say that the powers-that-be are a failure and we need better options? If you have friends who feel this way but aren't yet convinced that the libertarian approach is the correct one, voting for Jorgensen/Cohen is still their best option, because our ticket is the one among all "third party" choices that regularly gets the most votes. It's the one that's most likely to get reported on Election Night. Adding their vote to our total is the best way to help keep the idea alive that the Rs and Ds are not -- should not be -- the only choices.

Conclusion: Voting for Jorgensen/Cohen is the only way to <u>not</u> waste your vote for president / vice president this November.

Azadeh Weber Campaign

Azadeh Weber is in a five-way race for two positions on the board of the Saratoga Union School District, and she is now waging a very active campaign.

Her web site, at <u>azadeh4saratoga.org</u>, provides information about her background and issues facing the district. Volunteers have been helping by translating material on the site into five languages commonly spoken by residents of this district: Chinese, Urdu, Japanese, Farsi, and Arabic.

In addition, one of the measures on which the LP SCC had taken a position, the revision of the rent control system in Mountain View, was withdrawn by its supporters and will not appear on the ballot.

The LP SCC has endorsed the following positions on measures that apply to various cities and districts within the county:

Measure A - YES - Los Gatos - finance commission

Measure B - YES - Los Gatos - term limits

Measure C - NO - Mountain View - parking restrictions

Measure D - YES - Mountain View - amendments to rent control (withdrawn)

Measure E - NO - Santa Clara (city) - hotel tax increase

Measure F - NO - Milpitas - sales/use tax

Measure G - **no position** - San Jose - combined charter amendments

Measure H - NO - San Jose - card room tax

Measure I - NO - San Jose-Evergreen Community College District - parcel tax

Measure J - NO - San Jose-Evergreen Community College District - bonds

Measure K - NO - Franklin-McKinley School District - parcel tax

Measure L - NO - Campbell Union High School District - parcel tax

Measure M - NO - Fremont Union High School District - parcel tax

Measure N - NO - Loma Prieta Joint Union Elementary School District - parcel tax

Measure O - NO - Palo Alto Unified School District - parcel tax

Measure P - NO - Evergreen Elementary School District - bonds

Measure Q - NO - Mt. Pleasant Elementary School District - bonds

Measure R - NO - Cambrian School District - bonds

Measure S - NO - Santa Clara Valley Water District - parcel tax

Measure T - NO - Santa Clara Valley Open Space Authority - parcel tax

Measure RR - NO - Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Authority - sales tax

Going beyond just taking positions, members of the LP of Santa Clara County wrote and/or signed most of the arguments against the various tax and bond measures that are appearing in the official county voter guide. Thanks to Vice Chair **Mark Hinkle** for continuing this effort to inform voters of the negative impact these kinds of measures have on our local economy!

Jorgensen/Cohen on Track for 50-State Ballot Status

The Libertarian Party is one of only three parties able to regularly get its national ticket on the ballot in all 50 states (plus DC), and it looks like we are on track to do it again this year.

As of this writing, ballot status has been confirmed in 45 states, with petitions already collected and awaiting approval in four more (Iowa, Minnesota, New Hampshire, and Virginia) and the filing period still open in one (Rhode Island).

The other two parties with 50-state presidential ballot status are of course the Democrats and Republicans. The only other party likely to have their candidate on the ballot in even half the states is the Green Party.

Brian Holtz Re-Elected

Brian Holtz has been re-elected to the Board of the Purissima Hills Water District. Because in this case there were only as many candidates as spots to be filled, those candidates are considered elected and their names will not actually appear on the ballot.



It is not uncommon for positions of this type to go uncontested, so it's a good way to get started if you want to get involved as a public official. Most local districts have some positions up for election during each even-numbered year — it's not too early to start thinking about this for 2022.

If you have any idea that this is something you'd like to do, Brian suggests that you begin by attending the board meetings of one of your local districts -- you are very likely to find issues being discussed there on which libertarians could give useful input!

"Voter's Choice" in Santa Clara County

Santa Clara County switched to a new set of voting procedures starting with the March 2020 primary election. If you voted in that primary, you may already be familiar with this "Voter's Choice" system, but some of the details will be different this

November. If you <u>didn't</u> participate in the primary, you may be surprised by the changes!

The most important changes, compared with the pre-2020 system:

- Gone are the polling places for each precinct open on Election Day.
- Instead, there are "vote centers" fewer of them than precincts, but still spread all around the county where anybody from anywhere in the county can vote and get other election-related services, and open for several days.
- Everybody gets a ballot by mail -- and you can return it at a vote center, at additional official drop box locations, or by mail.
