## BYLAWS ARTICLE 11 - OTHER COMMITTEE (ALTERNATES)

Problem: As it stands, an unlimited number of alternates can be appointed which can be chaotic and unbalanced since alternates can generally debate and comment freely skewing the effective size of the committees. And it is not necessary to have so many "spares" as the Affiliate can always fill vacancies in the primary or alternate appointee.

Solution: Allow one (1) alternate for each primary seat.
Benefits: Eliminates the chaos of differing alternate numbers while still serving the function of having alternates.
