# Health service denies use of marijuana

The Associated Press

WASHINGTON — The government says Americans suffering from AIDS, cancer and glaucoma can't use marijuana to ease their plight. Officials say the drug might make them sicker.

The Public Health Service said Tuesday that only 13 people already smoking marijuana legally for medical purposes will be allowed to continue. Their supplier: the federal government.

"I think it's a decision ... made by some bozos that don't get their fat duffs out of the office and ask doctors who work with patients like this, talk to the patients who are using it, talk to the families and friends that see the difference, said Tim Braun, 44, an AIDS patient in Minneapolis.

Braun is among 28 patients whose applications for government-supplied marijuana had been approved by the Food and Drug Administration.

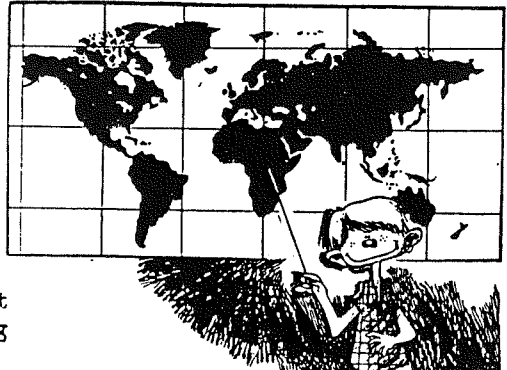

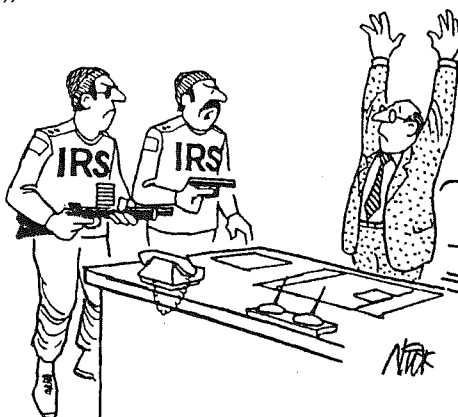

# Who Owns You?

There has always been this peculiar problem with freedom. People tend to avoid it. Only a handful throughout the ages have understood what freedom and personal sovereignty meant.

Put a number of free people on an island that offers a perfect climate and abundant resources and what happens? They immediately elect leaders who will control the resources and tell the people how to conduct their lives. They may be kindly rulers — but rulers they will be.

What causes this phenomenon? Why do people instinctively set up political systems and bestow their personal power upon a select few individuals, who, in turn, regulate the affairs of their fellow human beings? Our best guess is that people are willing to give up a little of their freedom in exchange for being free of the responsibility for their own actions.

Not only do various levels of government assume control of us, but certain businesses have an inordinate amount of power over people as well. The medical business is one.

Doctors are technicians. They have gone to the trouble and expense of gathering knowledge about human anatomy and sell their knowledge and services in the marketplace. They form associations to control their numbers in order to maintain a high price level for their services, and tend to be quite autocratic in their relationships with customers (patients) and their assistants. Their suggestions to patients, for example, are called "Doctor's orders."

Patients tend to forget that the person buying a service in the marketplace usually expects some measure of control in the transaction. But in patient-doctor relationships the customer becomes submissive and docile, setting personal autonomy aside and paying a large fee in the process. This is understandable in cases where the customer is seriously ill and is willing to do anything to become well, but one may wonder how a natural human process like birthing became an "illness" that requires spending vast amounts of money to "cure."

Health insurance is one of the culprits. People became willing to give up some of their income each month in order to contribute to a pool of resources that would pay the medical bills, if they occurred. This took the pressure off both the customer and

the medical provider to be prudent and medical prices have soared. A perfectly healthy pregnant woman is urged to buy a variety of tests and services because "the insurance company is paying for it."

If a woman is uncertain and needs reassurances she should be able to obtain them in the marketplace. But if she is confident about herself and there is no evidence of a problem with her prenatal condition, there seems to be little logic in asking her to submit to medical intervention — even in birthing. After all, she is a sovereign being with legal rights to bodily integrity. She "owns" herself.

The arrogance of the medical profession is manifested in many ways. The long waits in outer offices is one, as if it is generally assumed that a patient's time is of little or no value. As soon as more people rediscover that responsibility for health maintenance is theirs and not the medicine man's, we may begin to see a change in doctor/patient relationships. It all begins with the realization that you own yourself. You are not owned by governments or doctors.

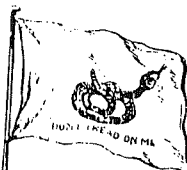

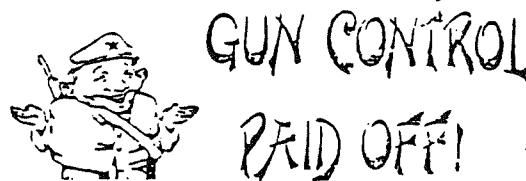
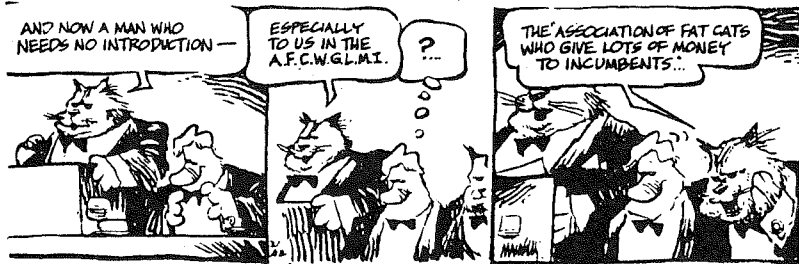

## WHO WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MURDER OF ABE LINCOLN?

Robert Todd Lincoln, somehow, knew. He was Paranoid about the murders; he was Garfield's Secretary of War, and had access to files that hardly anyone else did, and what he found in them he burned years later, so that no one else would see them, telling a friend who happened to interrupt that it was about a traitor in his father's administration.

A few days before his shooting, Garfield asked RTL about his father's murder, a strange coincidence. And after Garfield's shooting, he stayed away from presidents, having missed 2 in a row by only a few minutes, until, in 1901 he happened to be at the World's Fair in Buffalo, NY the same day that Pres. Wm. McKinley showed up....

But he stayed as Secretary of War through Chester Alan Arthur's term - because that coincidence put him into searching the files! And he had his own father's papers to search, too, his 3 brothers having died as children, and his mother having gone totally insane.

Exactly what he found I can't say, and he did not have access to the papers of Stanton where the missing pages of John Wilkes Booth's diary turned up about 100 years later, but here is the likely:

The conspiracy goes back before March 4, 1865 when Lincoln was sworn in for a 2nd term, at Mary Surratt's boarding house in Washington. She must have seen something, which is why she was tried blindfolded and hanged. On that date, Congress was not in session but the Senate had been called back for a special short session. The original plan must have been to commit the murders on that night! There were, after all a lot of parties that night, with the federal army in charge of the city, being still at war.

From March 4 to March 7, when the Senate met, organized and confirmed appointments, here is the presidential succession, which the Constitution did not specify then, not expecting this accident:

Pres: Abraham Lincoln

V-P: Andrew Johnson

Secy. of State: William Seward

Secy. of Treasury: vacant

Secy. of War: Edwin Stanton, etc. etc.

Under new rules the Speaker of the House would have come in 3rd, but the incumbent was not re-elected until December 5, 1865, when it came back to town. Likewise, the Senate did not get around to electing a Secy. of Treas. until March 7, Hugh McCulloch of Indiana, after it had named a Pres. pro Tem, Lafayette Foster of Conn., not an incumbent.

You see, the Secy. of the Treas. until March 4, 1865, was William Fessenden, who resigned to take a seat in the U S Senate for Maine.

And the 3 targets on the list, finally attacked on Good Friday after the war ended, were the first 3 names on the list. Lincoln died. Jackson's assassin got drunk instead, and never took a shot. Seward's assassin used a butcher knife & cut him all up, but missed the heart, so that he survived.

And there weren't enough for more than 3 tries at once, so those who had just come onto the list were not included.

Now you can go into some of the rest of the story at leisure, like how Lincoln was prevented from having the best bodyguard from the Dept. of War that night at Ford's theater.

But there was a traitor who wanted to be the new dictator with all the powers that Abe had abused.

Dear Prisoner:

*"The strongest reason for the people to retain the right to keep and bear arms is, as a last resort, to protect themselves against Tyranny in Government."* —Thomas Jefferson

Thanks for your letter on the Prison Industries of which we are only too aware. We have lots of Lost Trust.

Now let me explain some things about slavery in the United States. Amendment XIII, forbidding slavery says that convicted prisoners are excluded. It is a freedom. Come With the Wind, & Scarlett rented them as slaves in Reconstruction. But Amendment XVI extended slave labor to free workers, by imposing the income tax, which lets the cruel government force extra work for no pay to live free. It extracts from the income of a free worker not just the statist & feral income tax (& some cities!), but also the socialist insecurity tax, 2 unemployment taxes to aid the unworkers, workmens comp, liability insurance, muddyCare, & a variety of other impositions. Thus on a minimum wage of \$4 $\frac{1}{2}$ , the worker costs the employer \$7., & only gets about \$3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ; half of his work goes to some XXXX governmental program.

For the prison slave laborer, even more expenses have to be deducted from his pay. He gets 3 meals a day, lodging, security service, uniform clothes & laundry, and a variety of other services, mostly unwanted, including free medic care. He also gets lots of noises and smell for free. He has to work to pay for the soap he uses. 22¢ an hour is all that's left over for pleasures, like candy or cigarettes, & this is hard on the nicotine addicts. The free worker has to go to the supermarket etc. to buy his clothes, food, etc. He has to pay for costs like transportation that the prisoner does not, or he has to walk too. He has to pay for a roof to sleep under, and electricity for it, just as the prisoner has to pay for out of his work. It costs a lot to live outside!

I won't bother you with how free workers jobs are over-regulated by bureaucRats, like licensing, zoning, etc.

Now let us look at the slave labor population in the prisons. The smallest group, less than 1% are the political prisoners or convicted innocent who did not commit a crime. Next come the ones who have committed a real crime with a real victim, mostly theft not violent assaults. But the biggest group are those who have committed some victimless crime, either the prohibitionist drug laws or the tipsy highway drivers.

So these, with medical exceptions, do work either for other prisoners (cooking, laundry) or for govt. dept. (license plates, etc.) or for some ineligible buyer or employer. This is how a Damn Publican govt. works. Of course, there's a drug trade & a sex trade & a few more in the gulag. This is how Too-much-govt. works.

PS: Did you know that South Carolina now leads the US in percentage of prisoners? With US ahead of S. Africa & USSR, & maybe even Red China and Cuba?



After the Amish barn-burning in Pennsylvania, you are wasting your time on this kind of polling.

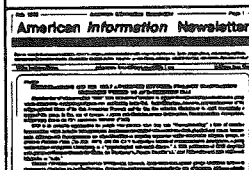
All you need to do, with 99.98% support, is to go to the legislature & ask for a bill requiring those who mistreat animals to submit to the same themselves:

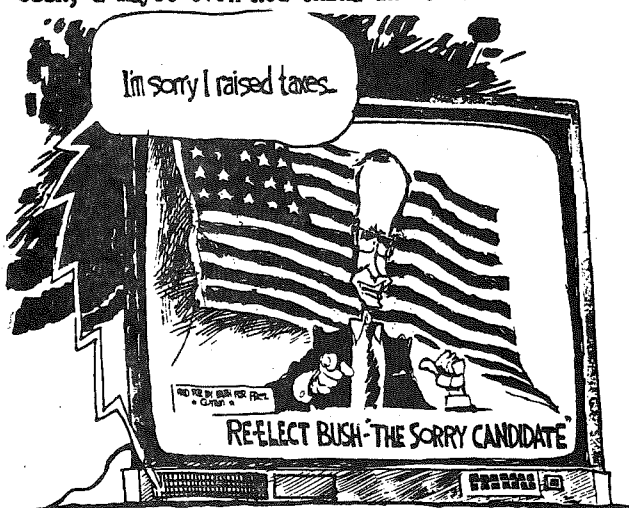

### IRS endorses living together

April has never been "IRS Appreciation Month," but tax slaves can now take heart. If you are employed and considering marriage, or dating another employed individual with Real Spouse Potential, the 1040 package — the one our tax forms came in — can be an eye opener. The government wants you to live in sin. Honest! See page 37. This should come as a great relief to many couples who, until now, had a vague feeling of moral unease from living in possiq circumstances. (POSSLQ is U.S. Censuseze for "Persons of Opposite Sex Sharing Living Quarters." You see, the government even has an official name for it.)

Let me give you a couple of examples. John and Joan, who met over the water cooler at Amalgamated Megacorp and are perfect for each other because they both program in LISP, decide to get married. They are both in their mid 20s and each makes \$18,000 a year. Their parents are overjoyed. Their friends are de-

lighted. Their CPA is appalled. As "married filing jointly" with a combined income of \$36,000, a standard deduction of \$5,700, and personal exemptions of \$4,300, their taxable income is \$26,000. They would have to pay Uncle Sam \$3,904.

The CPA looks at page 37 and points out that after a \$3,400 standard deduction and a \$2,150 personal exemption, John's \$18,000 salary is reduced to \$12,450 on which the tax is \$1,864. Ditto for Joan. Together they pay \$3,728 in taxes, for a savings of \$176 over what they would have to pay if they were married. John and Joan cancel the wedding cake and buy a VCR with the money they save by just moving in together.

Let's check on our lovebirds five years later. They both worked hard, got promotions and raises to \$26,000, and bought a three-bedroom, two-bath house in Exurbia.

"Honeybug," says Joan one evening during their candlelight dinner, "the doctor says it's going to be twins." John, after a moment of stunned silence, gulps out, "Great, Sugarplum, let's get married. You can quit your job."

Joan, the more realistic of the two, points out that if she quit her job they wouldn't be able to afford their mortgages.

Their parents are relieved. Their friends are sympathetic. Their CPA is appalled. With a combined income of \$52,000, itemized deductions of \$12,000 for interest, property tax and state income tax, and four personal exemptions totalling \$8,600, their taxable income is reduced to \$31,400. The tax bite is \$4,714.

The CPA fingers his calculator rapidly and says, "Look, folks, I don't want to discourage you, but..." He points out that if they stay single, and John claims the interest and property taxes on the house while Joan claims the two kids and a standard deduction for "Head of Household," their tax is only \$3,953. April is the cruelest month in more ways than one.

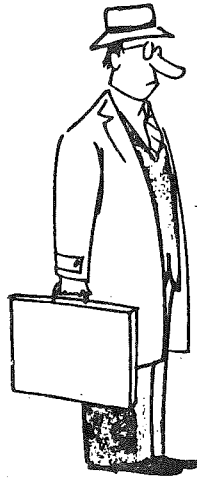
