Proposal #____ ARTICLE 1 AND TBD

Problem: Rogue boards have felt that they have had the authority to dissolve the Party or remove affiliation from national (and the newest thing is adding affiliation with a competing party). That is a step which should only be taken by an enormously high vote of delegates. This was partially foreseen back in approx. 2017, but now it should be apparent to all.

Solution: Puts the authority to dissolve existence or affiliation and to add affiliations in the hands of delegates at a regular (not special) convention.

Benefits: Keeps existential control of the Party with the delegates, and thus, the membership.
