News from National

The week up to and including Labor day will be the National Libertarian Party convention. It is being held in New York City. Libertarians from all over the U.S. will meet for business and pleasure. This convention will nominate The Presidential and VP candidates for 1976. Plan to be there, be a part of history.

News on the State level

For those of you who do not get the FLP newsletter, April 4,5, and 6th will witness the annual state convention to be held at the Williams Club, 25 East 39th Street N.Y.C. Why not plan to attend and meet Libertarians from all across the state. The keynote speaker will be Ed Crane, chairman of the National Libertarian Party.

Manhattan County has been chartered and joins Nassau and Kings county on the state committee. Suffork county and the Capital District Libertarian Party(Albany) are soon to follow.

There will be a motion introduced at the State convention to decentralize the FLP and have members of county organizations automatically be members of the state party.

In 1975 Mid- Hudson County Liberarians will be running campaigns. Ellen Davis has already announced for Duchess County executive, and Carol Cohen is running for mayor of Poughkeepsie.

The Capital District club has answered an editorial on T.V. speaking out against the Blue Laws.

The New Jersey L.P. had an editorial reply on WOR-TV. I have been told that they spoke in favor of Ford's import tax.(?)

March 2nd Meeting

The March 2nd meeting was hardly a revelation of the workings of the Tuccille for Governor campaign 1974. The major part of the meeting dealt with the falling out between Percy Greaves and the FLP, (as told by Ray Strong) a subject which I consider of little importance. The rest of the meeting brought out few new facts.

It was conceded that the campaign was a failure in terms of vote total but was successful in garnering media coverage.

Jerry Tuccille said that the campaign (continued p.2.

should have been aimed more toward the left(we did best in The Village and Cornell University). He also said that falling short by a \$100,000 in the fund raising drive reduced by half the size of the vote total we could have received. However, this still would have fallen short of the 50,000 vote goal.

I was told a couple of months ago that those in charge of the campaign had given us a 50 to one chance of getting 50,000 votes and the odds never became

more favorable.

Other speakers at the meeting were Gary Greenberg, Robert Klar and Carolyn Keelen. Carolyn discussed the T.V. commercial. She said that in a survey she conducted, everyone remembered the commercial but noone remembered Tuccille. There was no follow up to the commercial and people didn't connect it with Tuccille for Governor.

Overall I felt the meeting was unproductive, and the only people coming o out of the afternoon with a profit were the Capital District people who were selling L.O.S.E. buttons(Liberate Our Statist Economy) for .50 3/1.00. Still available from the Capital District Libertarian Party P.O. Box 2502 Union Branch, Schenectady N.Y. 12309.

For those of you who stayed away form this meeting you utilized your time more efficiently than I did. However I still urge you to attend the State Convention in April. It's a chance to meet Libertarians from statewide and

out of state.
