

## Call to execute all whites

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. — A black columnist on the newspaper serving Penn State University called for the mass execution of white people, triggering a wave of protests.

Chino Wilson, in a column published Tuesday in the Collegian, called for black people to "unite, organize and execute" white people who pose a threat to them.

"White people are irredeemable racists, who have never loved or cared about black people," he wrote. "To protect ourselves, we should bear arms immediately and form a militia to defend our property, our beautiful black women, men and children."

He further said white people created the AIDS virus "as part of a diabolical plot to exterminate black people."

Among those who objected were black members of the university's administration, which is trying to boost minority enrollment at the predominantly white school.

Almost immediately after the paper hit the streets, telephone calls and letters began arriving at the newspaper's office.

Two sign-carrying protesters demonstrated Wednesday, with one carrying a placard reading "White Person, Shoot Me," and offering a three-ring target.

People living on social insecurity were given a 3.4 cost of living increase in January. The \$10 raise in the water bill took about half of it.

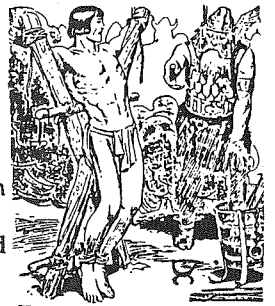
I also read where all government employees were given a cost of living increase of 4.5 percent. I guess government employees live higher on the hog.

## Bush Budget to Cost Typical Family \$14,918

The Bush administration's budget will cost the typical American family \$14,918 in 1991 taxes, according to a report by the Tax Foundation, a Washington

research organization. The group defines the typical family as two workers earning a total of \$53,265 and having two dependent children. According to the foundation, the family will pay \$10,568 in direct federal taxes - income and Social Security taxes - and \$4,350 in indirect taxes - corporate income taxes, employer's share of Social Security, and excise and other taxes. Taxes will take the biggest bite of the family's dollar, with federal taxes taking 28 cents and state and local taxes taking 9.9 cents.

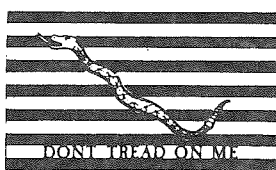
An Open Letter To Florence County Council:

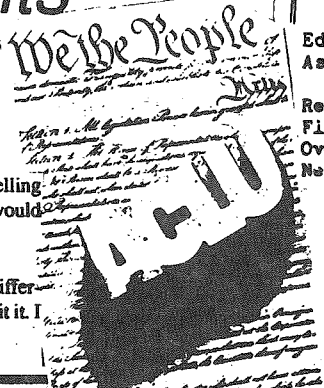

**Southern Willamette Alliance:** Why do you think that an organization with ostensibly such noble intentions as the ACLU is considered undemocratic, when it tries to uphold the very Bill of Rights which is the foundation of democracy upon which this country is founded?

**Dave Fidanque:** Well we do not live in a democracy. We live in a republican form of government, where we elect representatives to enact legislation on behalf of the majority. Despite all the checks and balances, our system is still subject to abuse. Our government was put together by folks who were inherently suspicious of government, who believed very strongly that all governments throughout history have tended to take unto themselves more and more power as time went by. And that's where the Bill of Rights comes in, to protect the inalienable rights of the individual to enjoy freedom of speech and religion, despite the whims of the majority.

**SWA:** If left unchecked, where would Reagan/Bush policies take us in terms of civil liberties?

**DF:** Well certainly at this point we are seeing some chickens come home to roost, in terms of the U.S. Supreme Court and the federal judiciary in general, where we have come to know—those of us that follow civil liberties—that we can no longer count on federal courts to protect civil liberties. We have seen come to power a series of presidents who, in the name of judicial restraint, have appointed judges who were unabashedly supportive of extending government power against individuals. It's the most anti-conservative philosophy that has permeated the federal judiciary in our history, and it's very ironic that it has come with the rise of the so-called conservative movement in the later half of the twentieth century—true conservatives want to see the government doing less, not more...

**SWA:** —That's what Reagan supposedly stood for...

**DF:** Well yeah, that's what some of the judicial appointees said they stood for, but their actions, I think, speak a lot louder than

their words. These are people who, for lack of a better term, are Statists, who virtually always side with the government against the individual. And that's very dangerous for individual rights, which is where our system of checks and balances becomes so important. As the courts become more and more hostile to the rights of individuals, the focus shifts away from the courts to the legislative branch, to Congress, and most importantly, to the States—to each of the 50 states.

And we're already seeing, I think, some of the worst that we're going to see in terms of the impact of the courts. Yes, there will be more cases—there will be more major losses over the next 20-30 years in terms of civil liberties.

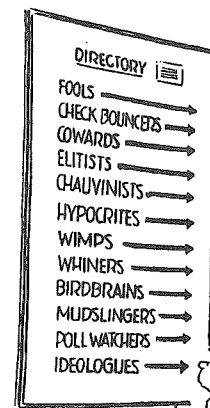
To a large extent, the job for those of us who care about protecting individual rights is going to be to keep bad cases from getting to the U.S. Supreme Court—making sure that rights get protected in other ways. And in some cases that's going to be very difficult—in some cases impossible without a great deal of public education. In some cases it might become easier, for example in what I see as a coming political firestorm around reproductive freedom issues. There's no question, in that issue, that those who support reproductive freedom are in the majority.

And the fixation of the new right—the radical right—on this issue in the long run, is going to be part of their downfall. Because they are in a minority. There will certainly be some states that will continue to pass reactionary measures regarding reproductive freedom, and we're certainly seeing that, but even in those states, I think we're going to see a major political backlash from those who support the right of privacy and reproductive freedom.

As the courts become more and more hostile towards individual rights, I think the inevitable result will be that people will become more involved in the political process and turn their attention, more forcefully, towards ensuring that elected officials are more responsive to their concerns on some of these issues. On other issues, such as crime, it's going to be much more difficult, because there, the vast majority of Americans are

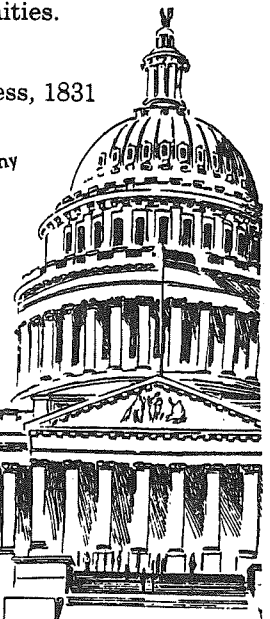

## 2 Fetal Deaths Linked to Maternal Seat-Belt Use

DUBLIN — Seat-belt injury caused fetal death in two pregnant women involved in traffic accidents, report Dr. Malcolm Griffiths, of Stoke Mandeville Hospital, and his associates.

Evidence of placental injury was found in both cases. The first patient, whose pregnancy was at 36 weeks' gestation when the accident occurred, had a spontaneous delivery of a stillborn; the placenta was found to be bisected. Postmortem examination of the stillborn revealed bruising over the posterior skull and evidence of acute asphyxia.

In the other patient, the accident occurred at 31 weeks' gestation. She was delivered of a fetus showing early signs of maceration. Histologic examination of the placenta showed an area of organized retroplacental thrombus and intraplacental hemorrhage, the investigators say (Br. J. Obstet. Gynaecol. 98:320-21, 1991).

Both women wore three-point seat-belts and had bruising on their chest and abdomen. The first patient had multiple rib fractures and possible cervical whiplash injury, Dr. Griffiths and his associates say.

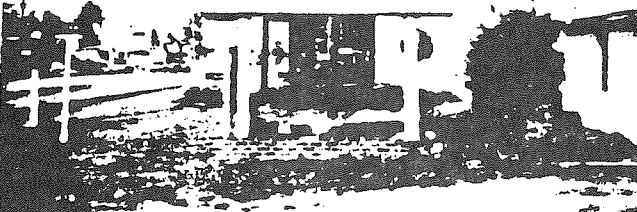
The incident occurred in East London in 1989 when Mr. Tutu, 34, made the threat after refusing to go through airport metal detectors.

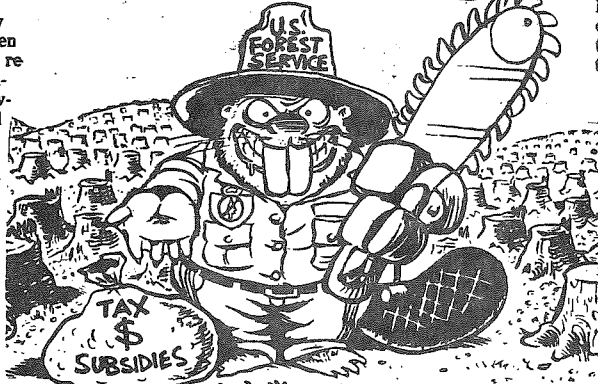

Although the council's chambers is no movie set, Weaver wanted a video history of what's often referred to as the best show in town.

There was nothing unusual about the meeting, which featured sharp-edged exchanges between council members, confrontations between County Attorney Ron Childress and Democratic council members who wanted someone else for the job, all punctuated by Councilwoman Irene LaBorde Neuffer's groans of disgust — "Oh, Lord!"

The only difference was the extra sheriff's deputies, apparently summoned in response to rumors that a large contingent of citizens from Eastover planned to show up to speak on behalf of a health center for their community.

"They called in for extra security," Council Chairwoman Bernice G. Scott, a Democrat, said about her GOP colleagues. Scott orchestrated the turnout for the health center in her district. "They were going to have me physically removed."

"Somebody told me this place was a zoo," said Louis Rivers, a northeast Richland County resident. "I wouldn't embarrass the animals like that. I think that animals get along better than that."

## Income tax is alien to American system

Earlier this year, the Connecticut legislature bowed to the demands of Gov. Lowell Weicker and imposed a state income tax.

States are willing, even anxious, to enact income taxes because of their revenue-raising ability, something clearly demonstrated by the federal income tax from its inception in 1913. But the idea of a tax on income is and always has been totally alien to the American system.

Reduce government's taxing power and government's so-called needs will shrink. As Frank Chodorow stated in his classic, *The Income Tax, Root of All Evil*, "a government is as strong as its income."

Once an income tax is in place, government has unlimited potential to confiscate and become a force dominating every aspect of life. And isn't that exactly what we are experiencing here in America? In the process, many who would be charitable cede the obligation to government; many who would ordinarily provide for their old age leave this obligation to government; and others who see the government providing schooling and even meals turn over their obligation to their own children to government.

George Washington once said, "Government is not reason; it is not eloquence; it is force! Like fire, it is a dangerous servant and a fearful master." Income taxes at any level are gasoline added to the fire.

The preservation of a free government requires, not merely that the mores and bounds which separate each department of power be invariably maintained, but more especially that (none) of them be suffered to overlap the great barrier which defends the rights of the people. The rulers who are guilty of such encroachment exceed the commission from which they derive their authority, and are tyrants. The people who submit to it are governed by laws made neither by themselves nor by an authority derived from them and are slaves. It is proper to take alarm at the first experiment upon our liberties--we hold this prudent jealousy to be the first duty of citizens, and one of the noblest characteristics of the late Revolution. 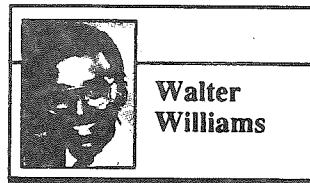

## Our nation needs a moral rebirth

A lot of people like to bemoan our national debt and what it means for future generations. But if you're old enough and really think about it, the national debt is minor in comparison to other things we're doing to future generations.

Years ago, the only worry a parent might have about kids playing in the street or walking to school is whether they'd get hit by a car. Today, many parents have to worry about whether their kid will be knifed, shot, raped or introduced to drugs. Even if kids get to school safely, parents have to worry about teachers attacking family values in the name of sex education and social studies.

Not all adults were angels in my old neighborhood. Some were involved in illegal betting, making bath-tub gin and gambling, but they had respect for children and didn't involve them. Any number of times I heard adults say, "Watch your mouth, don't you see children around?" Adults didn't curse at or around children, and chil-

dren didn't curse at or around adults.

Many of today's problems are a result of national moral failure. Future orientation is closer to the moral high ground; however, our national pastime is instant gratification. We see this in the decline in savings. Children are allowed to be present-oriented, like watching lots of television, rather than future-oriented, like reading and doing homework. The national debt is another moral failure. We are more concerned with current consumption than investment in the future. Our decaying infrastructure, roads, bridges and the like, reflect a greater willingness to use taxes for handouts rather than longer-

term investments.

The decline in individual accountability and the excuses we make for irresponsible behavior is another example of our moral failure. How many times have you heard a person reported as sick after he's torched a building, cruelly raped or murdered someone? By saying he's sick, we create excuses and a defense for the criminal. After all, who would punish a "sick" person? In most cases, the criminal can be better described as an evil person.

Every winter, the news media treats us to the sight of bums, hobos and derelicts, so-called homeless. We are supposed to believe they are blameless. You tell me how many people would become homeless if they: graduated from high school, got married before having children, kept a job and lived within their means, and saved for a "rainy day"? More money for federal, state and local homeless programs will only make irresponsible behavior less costly.

Billions upon billions of resources go into culturing and rewarding irresponsibility and non-accountability. Businesses are spared market accountability through tariffs and quotas on foreign products and other government-backed monopoly assurances. Billions in handouts go to farmers who refuse, or are too inept, to compete. Businesses lower standards to accommodate poorly prepared high school and college students. Judges set criminals free to prey on us, because state and local politicians would rather spend our taxes on handouts and convention centers than on jails.

There is little moral leadership from politicians and church leaders. To the contrary, most are at the forefront of the siege on morality. We need a moral rebirth. How it will happen is a mystery to me, but if it doesn't, America is going the way of other great nations, for the same reasons.

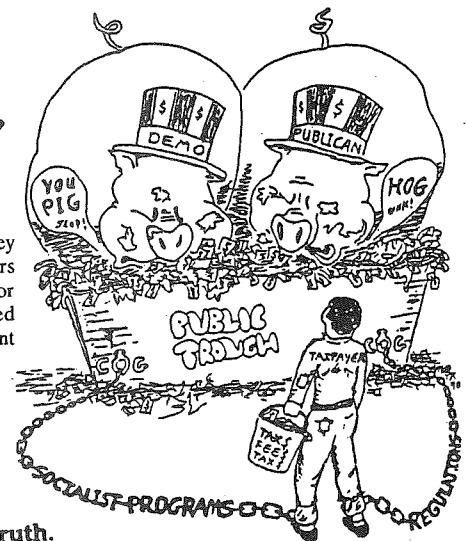

### FDA Nazis on the March

Early this year Chief-Statist George Bush, appointed Dr. David Kessler as his new FDA Commissar. Kessler immediately announced his intention to restore 'respectability' to the FDA by showing the vitamin companies who's boss. Kessler's idea of respectability is that which comes from the stern father, the playground bully, the schoolmaster or the Southern Church leader who whips incorrigible children until they bleed, if not until a few bones are broken.

Fortunately, so far, recalcitrant courts have shot down Vitamin Czar Kessler on each of his illegal attacks on law-abiding companies. Last issue we reported the Commissar's attack on Life Extension International in which he got shot down by the Arizona Attorney General who was unwilling to be sued to high heaven. The eager young Nazi's next attack was on Pets Smell-Free, a small company which developed a pet food additive to stop odors from feces, urine, gas and bad breath in pets on April 5. A Utah judge ruled that removing odors does not treatment for a disease constitute.

Kessler's third attack was on Traco Labs on April 10, whom he ordered to stop selling Black Currant Oil, a food additive. An Illinois judge accused the FDA Nazis of trying to 'redefine the terms' of the Food, Drug, And Cosmetic Act.

Kessler's fourth attack constituted a federally imposed temporary restraining order against Nutrilogy, a nutrient company. The Commissar accused Nutrilogy of 'fraud' and called the company's owners 'snake-oil peddlers.' A California judge denied the FDA's request for a preliminary injunction because the Vitamin Czar possessed no evidence of any kind to support his allegations.

Commissar Kessler is apparently on a fishing expedition to find a state which will put up with his antics. However, Kessler has become frustrated with American legal protections and is now pushing a bill, H.R. 2597, thru Congress in order to over ride these protections and carry out a full-scale national war against vitamins. LEI published its testimony against this bill in the August Life Extension Report. The bill is sponsored by Henry Waxman of Los Angeles and John Dingel of Michigan, two of the most Marxist-Leninist-Stalinist-leaning members of Congress and two of the most powerful members of Congress. Presumably their support for this bill comes out of resentment of the racial life-span gap which may continue to grow as long as educated whites are allowed to take nutritional supplements.

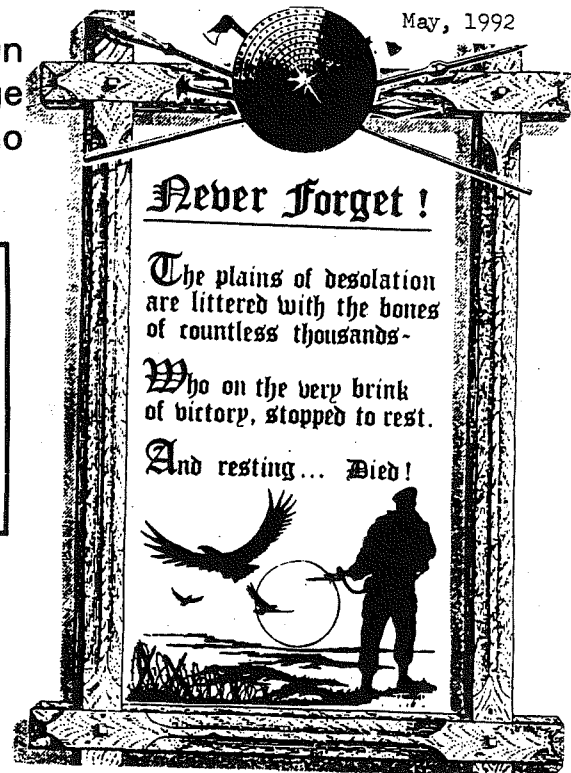
## Home fireworks shows may be facing 'endangered species list'

Libertarians want liberty; it's that simple, just like folks did in 1776.

## Freedom of the Zoo

While Americans still enjoy many freedoms, we are inching closer every day to a sort of "police state." Even as Lady Liberty was being raised in Shanghai, Mayor Ed Koch was releasing his new \$26.6 billion budget for New York City, which calls for:

- 1,668 more regular police officers
- 2,083 more corrections (city jail) officers
- 538 more officers in the Transit Authority and Housing Authority Police Departments
- 1,390 more workers to monitor complaints of child abuse and to run abuse centers
- 405 fewer street cleaners (leaving only 517, a 44% reduction)
- 133 fewer park maintenance workers
- 75 fewer workers in housing preservation and development

In addition, many libraries and museums must further curtail their hours, and new playgrounds will go unbuilt.

As Henry J. Stern, the city parks commissioner, reflected: "It's a signal that in the 1990s, the life-support agencies will have priority over the life-enhancement agencies."

Yes, Americans still enjoy many freedoms, including the freedom to be mugged, abused and surrounded by cops.

From a 9/1/26 speech by Ben Fairchild, who represented our district in Congress back in the 1920s:

"Centralized power in a republic means bureaucratic autocracy, and bureaucratic autocracy is worse than the autocracy of a single monarch, who can be made responsible for abuse of power.

That drastic power over the liberties and affairs of men known as the police power was reserved for the States. It is a power that must in any civilized society be lodged somewhere for the good of the community, but (so said our wise forefathers) never in a centralized federal government; never far away from the community."

This quote is from a speech delivered before the Crestwood Chemical Engine and Hose Company of Yonkers.

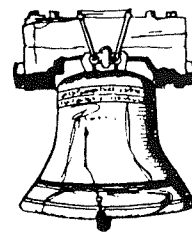

# Winnie Mandela, Queerbashing, and the Left

Several months ago a trial took place in south africa that might have been expected to be of great interest to the progressive lesbian/gay movement. Winnie Mandela was charged with and convicted of various charges connected with the kidnapping and beating of several young men, one of whom was later killed by her associates. What makes this trial relevant to the gay/lesbian movement is that at least part of the reason for this attack was that these men were believed to be engaging in sex with other men, an activity that Mandela apparently finds worthy of punishment by beatings, and even death. Over two years ago, when this incident occurred, Mandela was severely criticized by anti-apartheid activists in south africa. However, with the notable exception of the article, "Has Winnie Lost It?" in the May 1991 *BLK*, we have yet to see any criticism of Mandela by progressive lesbian/gay activists or publications in the united states, including radicals like *Queer Nation* or *Gay Community News*. A number of local lesbians even participated in the organization of a women's event in Boston in her honor last June. Apparently many radical lesbians and gay men feel that queer-bashing is okay, as long as it is perpetrated by other progressives like Mandela.

We concede that it is hard to know all the facts about what happened in this incident, but we have read nothing which leads us to doubt that anti-homosexual bias played an important role in the beatings and murder. Mandela herself admits that the presumed homosexual contact between her victims and a minister at a hostel in which they lived was the motivation for their abduction and beating. She claims, however that she was only trying to "protect" them from "sexual abuse," despite the fact the "victims" have never claimed that any abuse occurred. Like many parents who try to beat homosexual feelings out of their children, Mandela feels it is legitimate to torture those who prefer homosexual sex. If she were truly interested in protecting these men against alleged sexual abuse, why not deal with the supposed "abuser," instead of further abusing the "victims." The only abuse suffered by these young men was that inflicted by Mandela and her friends.

Such actions on the part of Mandela against her opponents should come as no surprise given her commitment to violence and bloodshed as the preferred method of dealing with problems. Mandela has been tied to three other kidnappings and assaults, as well as a disappearance, that took place within a few months of the events she was being tried for. She also has been quoted as saying, "With our matches and our necklaces, we will liberate South Africa," referring to the practice of placing gasoline-soaked tires around the necks of those some anti-apartheid activists consider "traitors", and lighting them on fire. Interestingly, just like Mandela's bullying of young queers, necklacing is used only against black people.

Unlike most of their counterparts in the united states, the progressive movement in south africa refused to keep silent in the face of Mandela's brutality. In fact, the first reports of the assaults and killing were published by an anti-apartheid newspaper, not the press controlled by or supportive of the government. Anti-apartheid organizations in south africa, such as the Congress of South African Trade Unions (COSATU) and the United Democratic Front (UDF), were quick to condemn such violence on the part of Mandela. The UDF/COSATU statement read, in part, "We are outraged at Mrs Mandela's obvious complicity in the recent abductions and assault of Stompie....We are outraged by the reign of terror that the team [Mandela's body guards, also known as the Mandela United Soccer Club or the Mandela Football Club] has been associated with. Not only is Mrs Mandela associated with the team, in fact, the team is her own creation. We are of the view that Mrs Mandela has abused the trust and confidence which she has enjoyed over the years.... The Mass Democratic Movement hereby distances itself from Mrs Mandela and her actions."

This rebuke from her former allies in the anti-apartheid movement came only five months after another challenge to her image as a well-liked opposition leader. In September 1988, Mandela's home in Soweto was burned down by local "comrades," apparently in retaliation for a sexual assault against a student leader by members of the "football club." (Apparently, real sexual abuse is acceptable to Mandela and her friends, as long as it is heterosexual.) The attack on Mandela's home appears to have been prompted as well by ill-feeling generated by Mandela's rather comfortable lifestyle, which includes ownership of a Mercedes, in the midst of the widespread poverty in Soweto. According to a source in the anti-apartheid labor movement, the public condemnation of Mandela by COSATU and UDF was prompted by pressure on the part of Soweto residents fed up with the activities of Mandela and her associates. Prior to the killing of Stompie Seipei, opposition among other anti-apartheid activists to Mandela's thugs had led both Oliver Tambo and Nelson Mandela to call on her to disband the club.

The left in the united states, hetero or homo, has never been very principled in its defense of individuals against the tyranny of progressive governments or movements. For instance, some gay/lesbian activists still defend the cuban politicians who imprisoned queers in the past and quarantine HIV-positive people today, practices these activists would find intolerable if engaged in by the united states government or its allies. Apparently, for many leftists, political leaders like Mandela and Castro who mouth the slogans of liberation do not need to live up to the same standards of behavior as mere mortals. In a column entitled "Leftist cheerleaders are often wrong, but never in doubt," Thomas Sowell discussed the mindset of Mandela's supporters: "Long before the present ugly episode, Winnie Mandela was justifying the hideous practice of burning political enemies alive. How could anyone have romanticized such a person? Like too many other issues, South Africa is not approached as a serious question about
