LIBERTARIANS NOMINATE DICKSAVADEL FOR UNITED STATES SENATE

Savadel Calls for Massive Tax and Spending Cuts and Opposes Draft

NEW YORK, April 14 --- Dick Savadel was chosen as the United States Senate candidate of the Free Libertarian Party at its state convention in Albany on March 29-30. In accepting the nomination, Mr. Savadel, 49, a computer systems manager from Glen Cove, Long Island, clearly drew the line between his own position and that of Carter and Javits inflationary domestic and war-mongering foreign policies.

Referring to Carter's efforts to deal with the economic mess we are in,
Mr. Savadel said in his acceptance speech, "Carter's revised budgets for 1980 and 1981
clearly show that each year taxes will increase; additionally, Carter's inflation
package did nothing to reduce inflation, and instead dipped and will dip even further
into every taxpayer's pocket. Even more ludicrous, Carter rules out a tax cut with
the excuse that it is inflationary! It is the Government's never-ending increase
in the money supply that causes inflation. I advocate an immediate \$50 billion tax
cut to be followed by more massive tax cuts as soon as we finish documenting the
many expensive and wasteful programs feeding the federal bureaucracy. I intend to
make William Proxmire look like a spendthrift!"

Mr. Savadel went on to say, "Unlike Senator Javits, I am opposed to the draft. Military conscription is the first step towards war. Rather than meddle in the internal affairs of other nations, the U.S. should follow a policy of non-intervention and peace amongst nations." Savadel agrees with the Libertarian Party presidential candidate, Ed Clark, who said, "You don't interfere in the

affairs of other countries. The Government hardly knows what it's doing when it interferes in our own country."

Mr. Savadel concluded by saying, "The United States stands opposed to all forms of tyranny, yet our Government continuously supports left-wing and right-wing dictatorships which is a policy destructive of our own national interest. We are hated by the people of many nations because we support their oppressors."

The Libertarian Party is America's third largest political party and its candidate for President, Ed Clark, will appear on the ballot in 50 states, more than any other independent candidate in the 1980 presidential election.
