THE COSTS OF GOVERNMENT

Karl Peterjohn ("Entrepreneurial Activism," April '91) writes that "debasement of the currency by the Federal Reserve continues."

Did you ever wonder why Congress doesn't raise hell at inflation, but instead gives COLAs to its retired employees and seniors? Consider that Congress is responsible, and costs us more than forty-four times as much for federal services than taking care of them ourselves.

When Congress votes to spend more than it takes in taxes, Treasury has to pay the difference, the deficit. It borrows money on the open market, selling bonds, mostly to banks. That drains supplies. Competition for what's left pushes up interest rates. People buy fewer cars and houses. Fewer businesses grow.

The Federal Reserve can step in to prevent unemployment and depression, or not, as it finds necessary. It has to balance between them. It drew back into the Great Depression. It dumped us into the "recession" of 1980-81 in order to halt soaring inflation, which hit 13 percent for a while. We are currently repressed because we are having inflation despite the Fed's holdback on money creation.

It does not matter that only a few in each generation will grasp and achieve the full reality of man's proper stature — and that the rest will betray it. It is those few that move the world and give life its meaning and it is those few that I have always sought to address. The rest are no concern of mine; it is their own souls...

I would like to receive information about your publication. A sample copy would also be nice. I would prefer, if possible, to have the info sent in a plain envelope.

To "print" money, it buys back bonds from the banks (or it can change reserve requirements, a similar action). It has no money. nor has Treasury, so it issues credit against the federal government's long dishonored faith and credit. The new dollars have no buying power, so they absorb some from existing currency. Each unit is worth less, buys less. It takes more to buy stuff. This is inflation.

Now comes the destruction which, surprisingly, has not been noted by "economists," one of which I seem to be. It takes more than ten dollars of job-making investment, of lives' savings, to create a dollar a year of productive income. So when an income dollar is undercut, ten times as many savings dollars are cut. That is more than ten times the deficit that caused the inflation.

So a dollar of income and ten of savings are damaged. eleven times the amount of a tax cut, for example, that increases the amount of deficit.

That's not enough damage. Federal overhead consumes around three-quarters of what is collected, ostensibly for our benefit. The true concern of people in government is the 75 percent profit they get. Buckley says we get back 18 percent, union leader James Farmer says the poor get 9 percent of what is collected in their names, but we'll stick with 75 percent as being easier to figure.

Four times 11 equals 44. So federal charity, educational spending, whatever, costs us forty-four times as much as caring for our own needs.

What can one do about it? I get the National Taxpayers Union's semi-annual reports on congressional spending. Obviously those in the top half voted to destroy everyone's life savings by inflation. A \$25 contribution puts one on the NTU mailing list, we can give more to support their attacks on federal spending, and we get the reports that let each of us attack our local spendthrift factually.

Connecticut Tax protest Newsweek

HARTFORD, Conn. — Thousands of protesters shouting "Repeal! Repeal!" rallied Saturday against a new income tax pushed through by Gov. Lowell P. Weicker Jr., who was jostled and spit at when he waded into the crowd.

About 40,000 people jammed the Capitol's south lawn. Some yelled that Weicker should be impeached.

Three life-size plywood tanks, their cannons trained on the Capitol, were painted with slogans denouncing Weicker. A "wall of shame" beneath the governor's Capitol office bore the names of the 75 state representatives and 18 senators who voted for the tax.

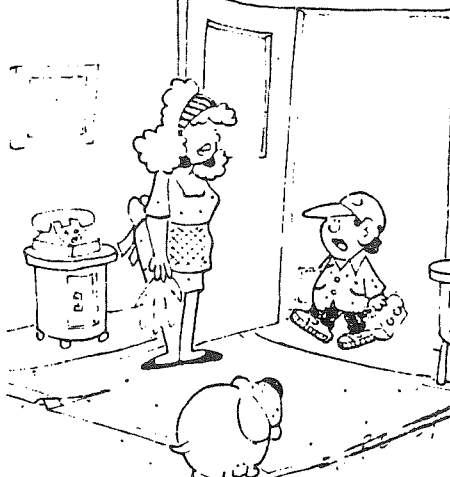

Police investigation hurt local family

On Nov. 7, of 1990, my husband James and I watched our house destroyed by fire. We lost our home, our possessions and our much loved cats.

Officer Tommy Sullivan of the sheriff's department was called to the scene. Officer Sullivan walked thru our house once and then called my husband in. I was continually asked to "excuse them," which I did not do. The fire started at approximately noon. I arrived home for lunch at about 12:10, so I figured I knew almost as much about where the fire started as my husband, who had been asleep on the sofa at the time.

After answering questions all thru the house, Officer Sullivan then told my husband that he would take him to the fire station "where he would be more comfortable to sign some papers." I was not allowed to go. Once there, Officer Sullivan interrogated my husband alone for over an hour. He was asked repeatedly what really happened. My husband gave the same account each time. He finally told Officer Sullivan that he would take a lie detector test. Officer Sullivan then read him his rights and told him he was going to jail, but in-

stead brought him back around to the house where he questioned him again. When Officer Sullivan left, we were told we would hear from him. We never did.

Over the next few weeks, we endured questions as to whether we were behind in our payments, how we really felt about our cats, and whether our marriage was in trouble. When the insurance company called, we went. We were cooperative in every way.

I understand that the insurance company and the sheriff's department have to ask questions, but I certainly think a more humane approach is needed. I hope this is not the way everyone who loses their home is questioned.

Officer Sullivan, I can assure you, if the shoe were on the other foot, you would not want to be treated the way you treated us.

Mayor resigns, or ... doggone

Bill of Rights has been repealed

Passed in 1791, this year we celebrate the Bill of Rights Bicentennial. My question is: Shouldn't it be a requiem instead? Let's see how some of the rights of the original 10 amendments have been surreptitiously repealed.

The Tenth Amendment guarantees: "Powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people." That's pretty plain language. So you tell me how the federal government can constitutionally mandate speed limits, control public schools and waste-disposal sites, and make hundreds of other edicts. Better yet, try to think of something you or your state can do free from federal mandates.

The Ninth Amendment provides: "The enumeration in the Constitution of certain rights shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people." The Ninth Amendment was written to overcome Alexander Hamilton's objections to having a Bill of Rights in the first place. Hamilton asked, "Why declare that things shall not be done (by the federal government) which there is no power to do?" That makes sense. Hamilton was simply asking why should we have a measure saying that the government cannot restrict the press when it has no authorization to do so in the first place. Hamilton's concern was since it is impossible to enumerate all liberties, such as economic liberty, politicians and judges would rule that they were not protected rights. The courts have made a mockery of the Ninth Amendment.

We retain a few protections of the Fifth Amendment, but they are disappearing. Among its protections is: A person cannot be "compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself." Try this: Ask your Internal Revenue Service agent whether the information on our tax form can be used against you in criminal proceedings. Then ask whether you are constitutionally required to give that information. Fifth Amendment provisions explain why we have the charade of voluntary tax compliance. That way, when you appear in tax court and ask that your tax form be inadmissible as evidence under the Fifth Amendment, the judge will say, "Sorry, you voluntarily gave the information."

The Fifth Amendment also provides: "Nor shall private property be taken for public use without just compensation." Not only has the court made a mockery of that provision, it permits, as in a Hawaii case, taking of private property for private use. It denies some owners of private property the right to raze it and build another building. It denies landowners the right to chop down trees on their own land.

In Moskva, C. Suchkin climbed into a 2nd story KOB window, & stole documents; he was arrested trying to throw them into US Embassy.

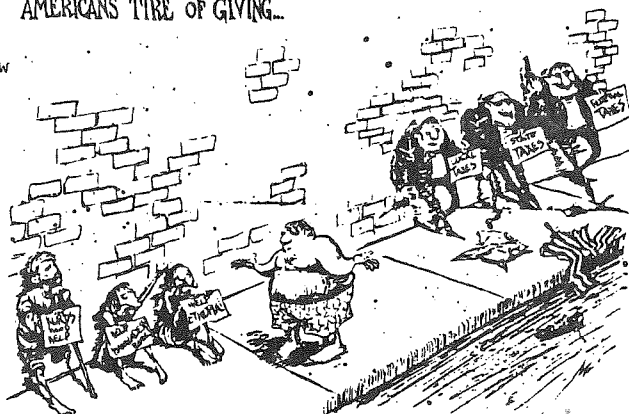
More parents are now running away from home than kids, say new divorce stats.

13-year-old shoots himself

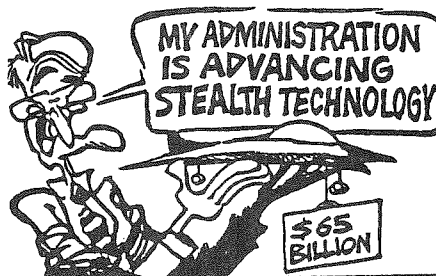
A 13-year-old Florence boy accidentally shot himself in the arm Thursday while slapping at a mosquito, according to Florence County Sheriff Billy Barnes.

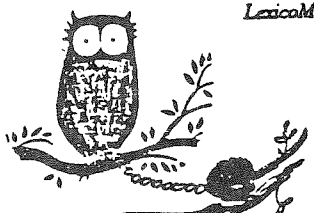
Only government mars life in S.C.

Are there Innocent Prisoners in America?

A large number of the people in our prisons are innocent of the crimes of which they were convicted. Some authors claim that five percent are. That amounts to over 50,000 people today. Some of the books that have been published on the subject are *Convicting the Innocent* by Edwin H. Borchard, a Yale law professor, published in 1942; *Not Guilty* by Jerome Frank, published in 1957; *Hanging in the Balance* by Leslie Hale, published in 1962; *Wrongful Imprisonment* by Ruth Brandon, published in 1973; and *Exonerated* by G. Wells and E. Loftus, published in 1984. (When looking in the library for books on this subject, look under the subject heading "judicial error.")

All of those books are eye-opening. Brandon, who lives in England, mentions that there is more wrongful imprisonment in the United States than in Europe. She shows that Americans don't care as much about the victims of injustice as Europeans do. When it is discovered that a person has been wrongfully imprisoned in England, there is a public outcry, and there is a

Armed citizenry is defense from tyranny

"Give up your guns," we are told by Handgun Control Inc. and by its liberal political and media supporters.

We first heard this in 1768 when William Knox, under-secretary of state in the British Colonial office wrote: "What is Fit to be Done with America?"

"The Militia Laws should be repealed and none suffered to be re-enacted, and the arms of all the People should be taken away... they will have but little need of such things for the future..."

payment of money to the victim. In the U.S., there is generally only apathy in such situations, and the victim receives no payment at all. Borchard also deplored that situation.

Some U.S. states are more notorious than others in their cynicism in regard to false imprisonment. Pennsylvania, for example, seems to be very bad. Wells and Loftus mention the case of Robert Dillen, who was falsely accused of numerous crimes in Pennsylvania, beginning on July 17, 1979. His lawyer finally advised him to leave the state, which he did. Pennsylvania's persecution of Dillen was so notorious that it was the subject of an article in *Reader's Digest* in October, 1981, on pages 104-109.

In addition to the innocent people in our prisons, there are a lot of prisoners who committed only "victimless" crimes, such as selling marijuana or buying pornography. Such prisoners were often the victims of entrapments. The September, 1988 issue of *Playboy* had an article about "Operation Borderline," in which federal agents entrapped a number of people into buying illegal pornography.

Some of the people in our prisons are "political" prisoners, who were framed on criminal charges in order to imprison them. A recent case of that kind is that of Mark Curtis, of Des Moines, Iowa. He was a union activist and a member of the Committee in Solidarity with the People of El Salvador, an organization that opposes American policies in Central America.

Among the people who say Curtis was framed are Neo Muzzana, the U.N. representative for the African National Congress; Coleman Young, mayor of Detroit; John Conyers, congressman and chairman of the subcommittee on criminal justice; and virtually every labor union in the U.S. An editorial in the *Daily Iowan*, the student paper at the University of Iowa, concluded, "If it is a frame-up, and if the authorities can succeed with Mark Curtis, who's next?"

Many of the robberies and other crimes for which people go to prison would not have been committed if drugs were not criminalized. Illegality is what keeps the price of drugs so high that people have to steal to get the money to buy them. It also forces and otherwise encourages drug addicts to become pushers, selling drugs to get the money to buy their own drugs, and causing other people to get hooked.

Thus, one of the causes of real crime is this country's laws against "victimless" crime.

The government seems to be increasing the number of phony cases in order to make the statistics in the "war on drugs" look good. I have been particularly horrified by the case of one prisoner I met while in the federal prison system, Pedro Guerrero. Hired as an errand boy for a Miami restaurant owner, he received a 12 year sentence (with good time he'll be out in just over 10 years!) for just being there. His employer had shipped drugs into Miami in a container load of tropical food products. There was not one shred of evidence offered that Pedro knew there were drugs present. In fact, while the shipment was being unloaded at the warehouse, he left the scene and called the Food and Drug Administration's food inspectors to come look over the shipment and issue the inspection permits so that it could be delivered to the restaurant. If he had had the slightest knowledge, or even a suspicion, that drugs were present, he would not have done that. All he would have had to do was wait until the cargo was unloaded to remove the drugs. Federal inspection of imports is on an honor system — until the FDA is called the inspector doesn't come — so the consignee has control of the uninspected shipment. Despite this rather clear evidence on his behalf, and with no evidence offered against him, a Miami jury convicted him and he was sentenced in October of 1988. As of April, 1990 — a year and a half later — he is still in prison waiting for the court to allow him to file an appeal. Should he win, and that is difficult in even the most obvious cases of miscarriage of justice these days, he will have wasted years of his life just waiting for his case to be heard. He is only 24-years-old now — what kind of future can he possibly have when he is released in his mid-thirties after a decade in prison for a crime he obviously didn't commit?

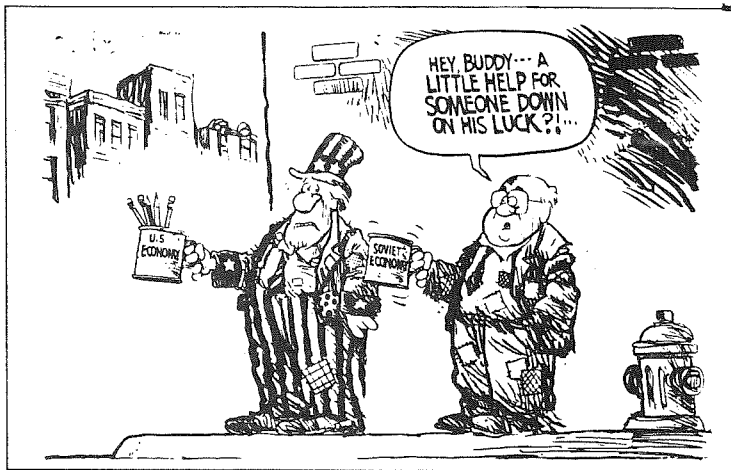
Christians Win One

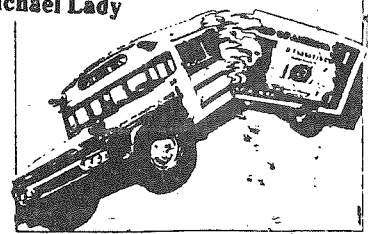
