The administration is mistaken if it believes the nation's \$3 trillion economy can be successfully managed by Mr. Volcker or any other man or even any body of men. The real issue is our Federal Reserve System itself—an inevitably diastrous way to run a supposedly free enterprise economy.

Paul Volcker is not the issue, though his record has hardly been illustrious. Since Mr. Volcker took office in August 1979 we have had the highest interest rates, unemployment rates and bankruptcy rates in 40 years.

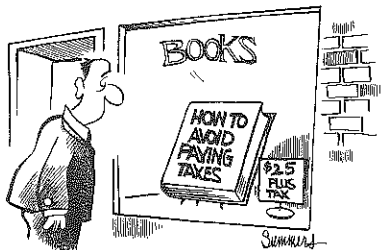
It is the Federal Reserve System itself that has caused past instability, not the individual men who run it. Stability in economic affairs is desirable, but stability cannot be achieved by keeping the same men in charge of the Fed. In a little over a decade, from 1971 to 1982, the Fed has caused three recessions, record high interest rates, double-digit unemployment, and thousands of bankruptcies, by manipulating the nation's money supply.

No man or body of men has the intelligence or wisdom to manage the money system of a \$3 trillion economy. Central banking is a throwback to central economic planning, and central economic planning failed wherever it has been tried. So has central banking. It is time to end an over 70 year experiment and allow money decisions to be made in the marketplace, not in Washington, D.C.

Buses need a profit to operate efficiently

Recent letters regarding bus service remind me that about 30 years ago railroad passenger service carried many millions of passengers. But the Interstate Commerce Commission refused to allow the railroads profitable rates. As a consequence, although it took years, the railroads wormed out of the passenger business. Now we have almost no passenger service except heavily subsidized AM-TRAK.

Is South Carolina developing a parallel? In 1983 our Public Service Commission required South Carolina Electric and Gas Co. to lose almost \$5 million on transit. Now I am reading complaints about bus service in Columbia.

Do you believe in the carrot or the stick?

Do you think the PSC is going to succeed where the ICC failed? Will the PSC be able to make SCE&G improve bus service by making them lose money? Or would we all be better off to provide that good old American profit motive?

As a Libertarian, I believe in no subsidies: Everyone should pay his own way. Those who think that transit riders or honey farmers or dairy farmers or tobacco farmers or maritime unions — or such as Chrysler — should be helped should help them with their own money. Leave others the freedom to make their own decisions about whom to help.

Don't bother to tell me that SCE&G shareholders make so much on power that they can afford to subsidize transit. First, I do not agree that the fairness of robbing anyone is proportional to his assets. Second, while some shareholders are wealthy, many live on pension funds and many others are not wealthy. Third, if SCE&G has been such a good investment, how came the real value of the stock to decline more than 80 percent in about 20 years?

A COCKEYED LOOK AT POLITICS

Let me explain reason #1 why the system does not work: the Peter Principle. Elective offices are held by those who excel at getting elected; the successful candidate often makes a disastrous officeholder, as he has reached his level of incompetence.

I will not pile historical examples upon you, all the way back to the 1790s, of competent generals or governors or senators who were a disaster as president; of great orators who made foolish senators, & so on. Consider U. S. Grant! Huey Long! Herb Hoover! Bluntly, the ones who get elected are those who are good as candidates.

That's the bad news/this is the good news:

It is possible to get competent nonstatists elected to office. The trick is to improve the skills of being elected.

Now, as the anti-political libertarians, "Why bother?"

If the State can be made irrelevant, there would be no need.

To get the public to accept the idea that the government should be ignored, it is necessary to convince at least 70% of the population (the other 30% being almost exclusively children). 65% is not good enough; many totalitarian countries have that many against the government.

But to take control of the government, and dismantle it from within, you need only about 15% of the population. About 45% of the population is not eligible to vote, either because they're too young or not registered. Of the remainder, about 26% can vote but does not; the remaining 29% votes. All it takes is a majority. With a viable 3 party system, it could take less, because winning candidates don't have to have a majority. Control of either house of Congress would be adequate, simply by refusing to pass appropriations bills, to reform the system.

This is not just theory: with control of just the House of Commons, 17th century reformers brought down the power of king & nobility in just this way. Colonial legislatures did the same to royal governors and councils.

Now, what do we learn from all this?

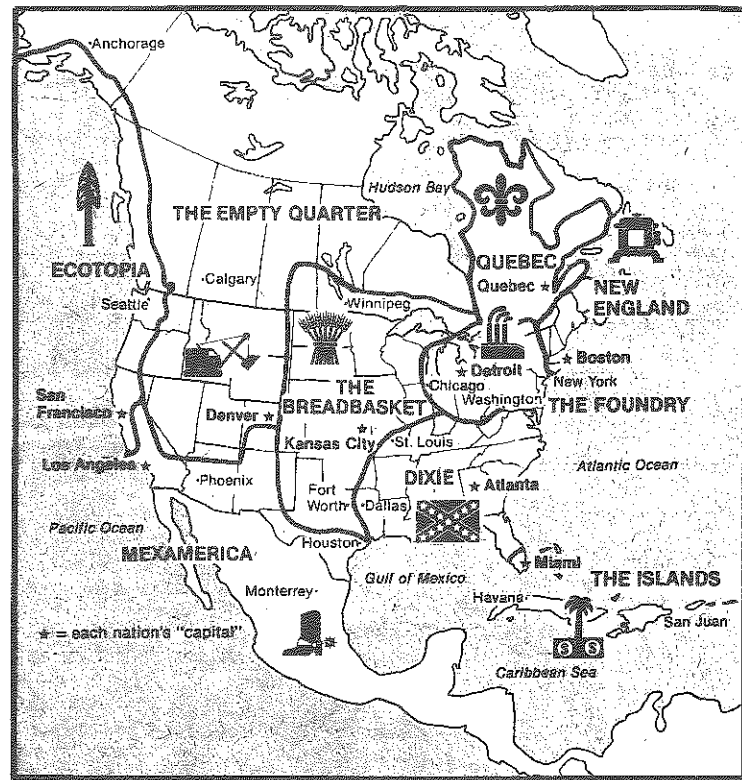

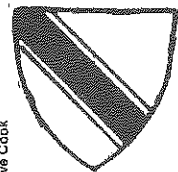

trend persists - some climatologists forecast a much colder climate by the end of the century - it could change world affairs drastically.

3. "The South Will Rise Again" - despite the pleasantness of the prospect, it would take at least 2 or 3 major changes: (a) the dissolution of the Soviet Union, because the fear of the other super-power is one of the major forces holding both together; (b) weakening of the psychological bonds, such as conscription, govt. schools, that have brainwashed many Southerners; (c) a continuation of the trend away from large nation-states.

4. "World War III ?" - has to be considered as a possibility. Some futurologists predict that 1999 will be the crucial year; essentially, it depends on a host of other factors. There is, of course, the chance that it might start accidentally.

5. "Fascist Amerika" - is always a possibility; Huey Long forecast it more than 50 years ago; there are several proto-fascist movements, and not just on the lunatic "right fringe"; it is actually the social democrats that worry me most. The trends exist: a lowering of economic expectations, and all the rest.

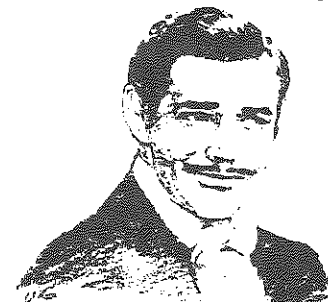
As for advice, I have little: Be Prepared.

First, I make no claims of psychic powers. I do not predict what anyone will do, even when he says he will do something.

Here, however, are a few possibilities for you to consider.

1. "After Reagan, the Deluge" - the world banking system is riddled with bad loans made to 2nd & 3rd world governments, who are invariably less than eager to repay; many large US banks are technically insolvent by any sound accounting rules. European banks, except for the Swiss & British, have even less in reserves. The whole thing is like patching an old inner tube; at some time it becomes useless. Many experts expect something to give about 1989.

2. "Bad Weather; Comrades" - After 65 years of making excuses for the failure of collectivist farm programs, the Soviets really have had a run of bad weather, that cost them as much as 30% of the expected wheat crop, in recent years. Russia & Canada are both situated where the growing season is just a bit more than the necessary time to grow grains; if the

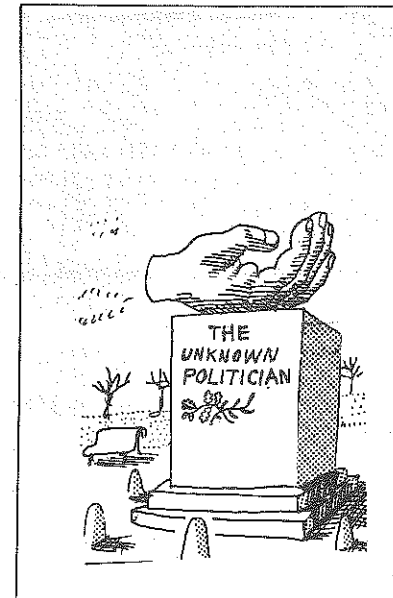

LONDON—In an attempt to reduce her taxes by 67 percent, a London widow had workmen come in and demolish the top two stories of her Victorian home.

"The house is ruining me," explained Rose Stevenson, who shares the remaining ground floor with 16 cats. "After all, it's only bricks and mortar."

Stevenson was initially successful in persuading the local tax official to reduce her taxes from \$875 to \$305, based on the reduced amount of property involved. Unfortunately, the house happens to be situated in an official conservation area, where owners have no right to make unauthorized modifications of their homes.

As a result, the local council has since ordered Stevenson to restore the demolished two stories at her own expense—and resume paying the full tax rate when she does.

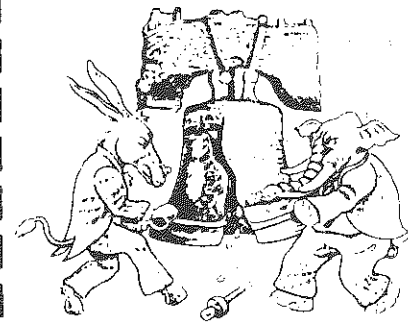

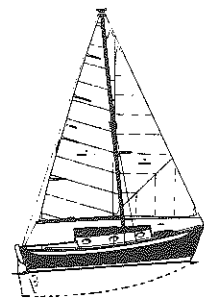

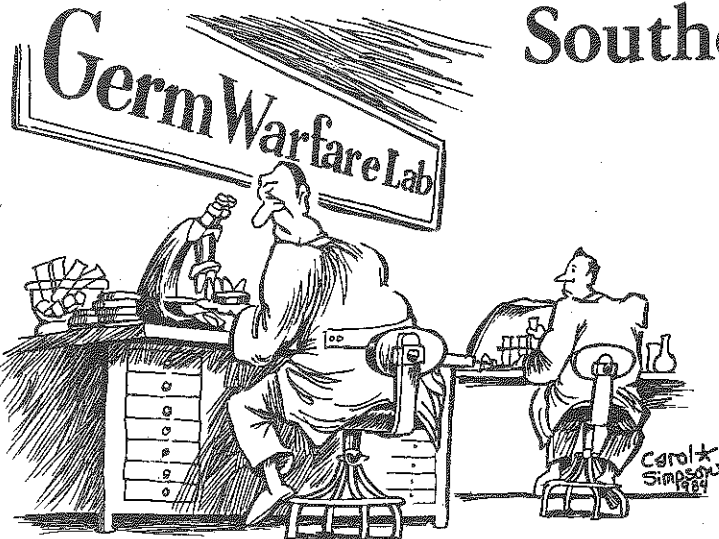
