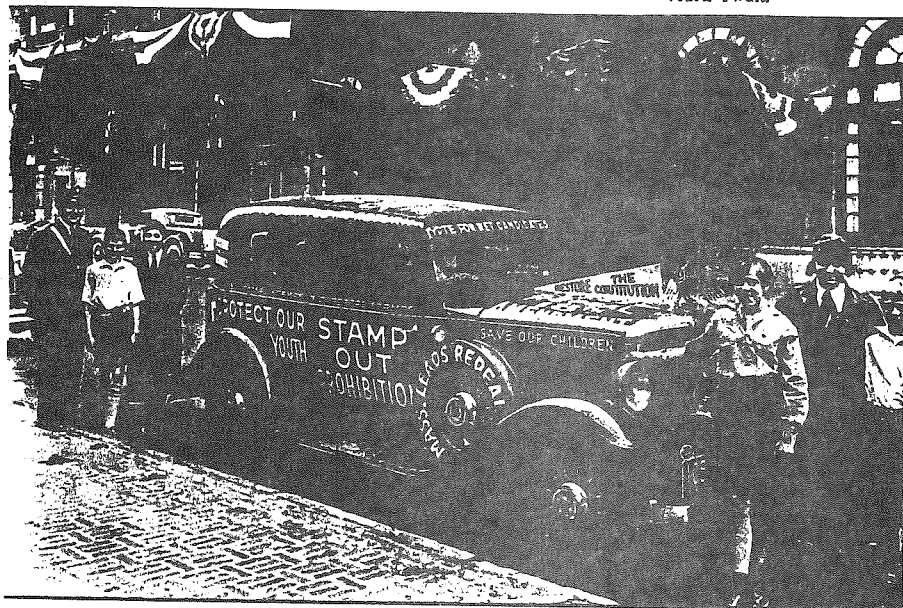

## Alleged secessionists detained

SEVEN supporters of the United Sabah Party (PBS) continue to be held in detention without trial under provisions of the Internal Security Act of 1960 (ISA). Vincent Chung, Jeffrey Kitingan, Ariffin Haji Hamid, Benedict Topin, Albinus Yudah, Abdul Rahman Ahmad and Wencelous Damit Undikai were arrested in 1990 and 1991 for alleged involvement in a plot "to take Sabah out of the Federation of Malaysia". The federal authorities have yet to present any evidence to substantiate this accusation. Al believes that the seven may have been detained solely for their non-violent activities within the PBS, a legal political party currently forming the state government of Sabah, which has been involved in political conflicts with the federal government.

The ISA has previously been used to detain non-violent critics and opponents of the federal government, including a number of prisoners of conscience who were held for more than 10 years.

## Tories

**HEARTLESS** Tory bosses have banned the jobless from seeking work at their snooty club in a city where 8,000 are on the dole.

They have branded the unemployed as "cheats" and say they will give the part-time evening bar work, earning £2.04p an hour, only to those who already have full-time jobs during the day.

The secretary of the Lakenham Conservative Association Club in Norwich told the Mirror yesterday: "The current vacancies are not open to the unemployed because they might cheat by pocketing both their wages and dole money."

The decision angered the Labour MP for Norwich South, John Garrett, and he said: "This is a disgraceful. It makes the assumption that anyone on the dole is a cheat. It is hard enough being unemployed

without being discriminated against."

The club advertised for staff in a local newspaper, adding: "Only applicants engaged in full-time employment considered."

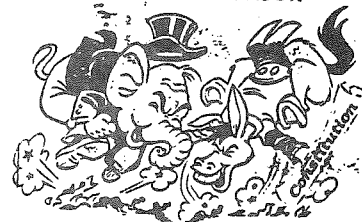

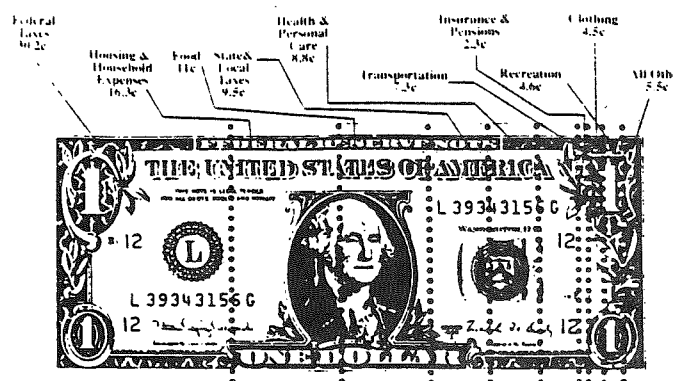

The incident was filmed by an off-duty TV news cameraman on Anglesey and shown on nationwide television.

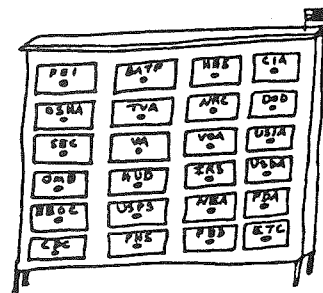
A police spokesman said inquiries were continuing and reports would be made to the Director of Public Prosecutions and the Police Complaints Authority.

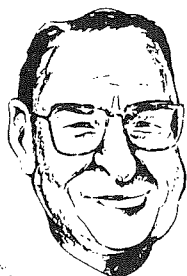

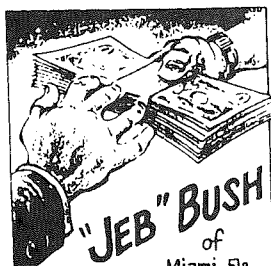

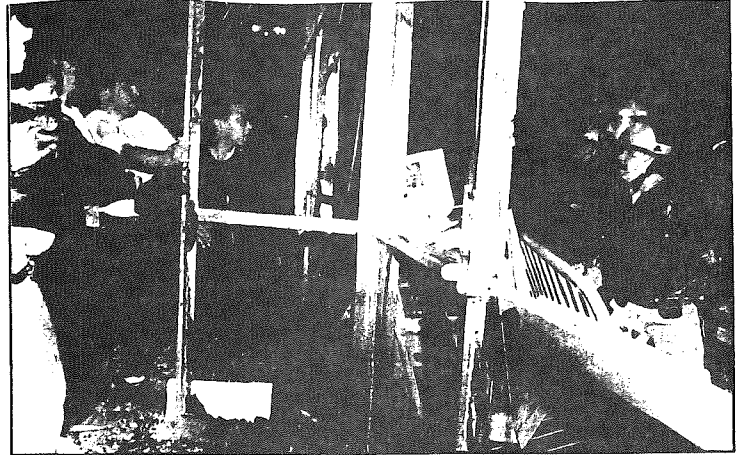
The Socialist Congressman in Vermont might add to the Democrat vote. Also some states will have more or less members of Congress by January, 1993.

## Ron Paul has the only solution for the deficit

Neither Vice President George Bush nor Massachusetts Gov. Michael Dukakis succeeded in politically framing the central economic issue facing the country: Reducing the federal deficit to a non-threatening level without doing serious economic harm to the economic expansion.

This leaves a leadership vacuum that will be filled by the National Economic Commission, which missed its first open hearing on "deficit reduction" Nov. 15. Other sessions, open and closed, are scheduled through Dec. 7, leading to delivery of its "preliminary report" on Dec. 21.

In fact, the two appointees of President-elect George Bush won't even be sworn in until Dec. 20, the same day the first draft will be voted on by the full committee.

Worse, there is now only one member of this 12-member "bipartisan" commission (created by Congress with President Reagan's signature) who supports Bush's pledge against new taxes: Dean Kleckner, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation.

In an interview, Paul said, "I consider the most dangerous threat to our economy is our soaring federal and private debt. The budget deficit has to be brought down."

Over a period of years, like the Bush flexible freeze?

"No, we should do it right

away, because there is no way — given Congress and the business cycle — that a three- to five-year plan can ever be credible."

One year? Wouldn't that mean massive new taxes?

"Absolutely not. A tax increase would do great harm to the economy, and it wouldn't cut the deficit. It all has to be done by cutting spending."

But where would you find \$120 to \$150 billion in spending cuts?

"First, I'd close down the farm subsidy program and save \$17 billion a year. The program is not helping farmers, and it sure isn't helping the nation or the consumers."

"Second, I'd freeze all cost-of-living raises on entitlements and Social Security. That would save at least \$10 billion a year. As part of that, I would propose a gradual, phased transition to a more privatized retirement system."

"Third, I'd freeze the current

benefits of the Medicare program. That would save about \$8 billion a year. As long as we accept government as provider of medical services, government will push costs up, but the distribution and quality have not been going up. All we have done is accelerate medical inflation. We should find ways to get the government out of the medical business."

But so far, you have recommended only \$35 billion in cuts?

"I would never cut defense, but we should cut military spending. There's a distinction. We should make Europe become more self-reliant. After all, we only have enough equipment to fight a conventional war for two weeks in Europe. I think NATO has weakened the West rather than strengthened it, because they have become more dependent on a weak conventional force."

"We could cut \$85-100 billion a year in military expenditures without cutting the real defense of this country, by emphasizing a modern space-age approach rather than a World War II approach, and by backing away from our interventionist foreign policies, including keeping 40,000 troops in Korea."

We asked Paul if he didn't think that because of Gramm-Rudman-Hollings the budget deficit as a share of gross national product is going down fast enough?

"No. GRH is not working. We are still accumulating \$150 billion in new debt every year, so it's misleading. Either the budget deficit is a serious problem or it's not. I just don't think deficits as a share of GNP is a reliable statistic."

In addition to balancing the budget without new taxes, Paul wants to abolish the Federal Reserve and reinstate the gold standard, not by government fiat but by legalizing monetary coinage and competition.

# marijuana is a medicine

## BRYSON CITY, N.C.

Michael Kane has tried every drug prescribed by his doctors to ease the pain from a crushing injury eight years ago.

Nothing works except marijuana, he says.

"I take a couple of puffs and it lowers what I call my disgust level," said Kane, 37, who lives with his four dogs on a small mountain farm just outside Bryson City. "It's like watching the level on a meter. It just drops."

But the government says Americans suffering from AIDS, cancer, glaucoma and other physical problems can't use marijuana to ease their plight, because it might make them sicker.

Only about three dozen people are exempt. Kane is not among them, and says he has to buy the drug on the street for about \$200 an ounce.

"It's a double whammy," he said. "I'm not able to function in society, but if I buy pot, I've got a criminal stigma attached to me."

In 1984, Kane was working on a large water-treatment project in Florida when he was blown off a platform by a ruptured high-pressure hose. He's since had several operations for severe neck, shoulder and arm injuries.

"Michael has a tremendous amount of muscle spasms in his left shoulder. The muscles are rock-hard," said Dr. Terry Clark, an Asheville psychiatrist who's treated Kane for several years.

Kane said the injuries make it impossible for him to work, he has severe headaches and he can't sleep more than a couple of hours at a stretch.

## Haitians Return Waste

The industrial world's habit of dumping waste in Third World countries may soon change as they find it being dumped right back.

That's what two environmental groups in Haiti are doing with some of the 2700 tons of Philadelphia's incinerated waste that has been shipped to their country. As Milton Friedman pointed out recently in *The Wall Street Journal*, the homicide rate rose sharply during Prohibition in the 1920s and also during the drug wars of the 1970s and 1980s. Last year, a record 23,438 Americans were murdered, a figure fueled in part by drug-trade violence. Also, a large proportion of petty thefts and property crimes are committed by addicts who must pay high prices for their black market drugs.

• Drug war costs are increasing. This year's federal drug control budget is over \$10 billion. The already overburdened states put up a roughly equal amount. Over a 10-year period, we have spent nearly \$100 billion to combat the drug trade and to "stamp out" drug use. Prohibition is a fiscal rat-hole of historic dimensions.

An unusual billboard intended to provoke debate on racially exclusive golf courses did just that Friday, prompting a rash of angry phone calls and threats of vandalism from annoyed viewers.

The billboard, on the Tri-State Tollway (Interstate Highway 294) just north of 83rd Street and adjacent to a public warehouse in Justice, shows a black man sitting on a golf cart, smiling and holding a golf ball in his hand.

"Afro Country Club," the wording reads. "Where only the ball is white."

The billboard is the work of artist Mark Heckman of Grand Rapids, Mich., who said he has produced two dozen political billboards in recent years. Among the best known was an AIDS awareness sign displayed in Chicago in 1989 featuring 2,001 condoms dipped in paint and thrown against a canvas.

Heckman, who is white, said his latest work was prompted by the recent controversy over golf courses, including several in the Chicago area, that do not have any black members.

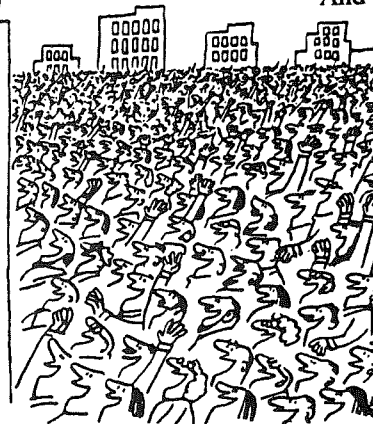
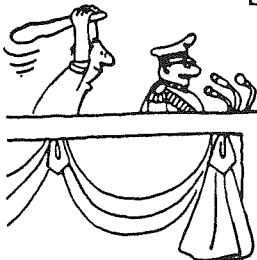

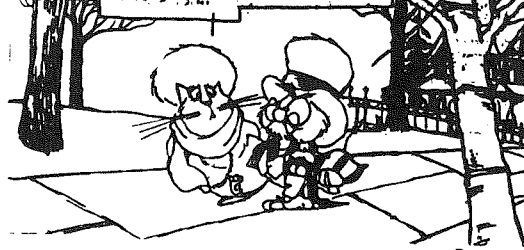

Rushdoony: Christian Reconstruction means the reordering of every area of life and thought in terms of the whole word of God.

What is the difference between a Christian and a Christian Reconstructionist?

Rushdoony: The difference between a Christian and a Christian Reconstructionist, at its extreme, can be described this way: There are people who as a result of war or accident are basket cases. They are missing their hands or feet. They are individual human beings, but they are seriously incapacitated. There are many people in the church who are basket cases. A Christian Reconstructionist is someone who is alive, healthy and active in the Lord's service.

Should we believe that eventually a majority or all Christians will be Christian Reconstructionists?

Rushdoony: Yes, and that Christians are going to exercise dominion in every sphere of life and thought. The church is not the only place for us to be Christian. We are to be Christians in every sphere and to bring every area of life and thought into captivity to Christ.

Are we to do this in a lowkey kind of way so as not to appear to be on the lunatic fringe, or are we to come with both barrels blasting and to heck with appearances?

Rushdoony: Really neither. We're not out to hide what we're doing, or to be offensive about it. Christian Reconstruction means that we take God seriously. That we take His law seriously. That we apply it in our lives. And that's it.
