Libertarian Party United States Senate Candidate

Norma Segal will be in the Capital District on Thursday August 27th to announce the filing of nominating petitions placing her and the Libertarian Presidential ticket of Andre Marrou and Nancy Lord on the ballot this November.

She will hold a press conference at the Legislative Office Building Press Room 130 at 2:00 P.M. August 27 to kick off a state-wide campaign for the seat now held by Republican Alfonse D'Amato.

Norma Segal, a former New York State Chair of the Libertarian Party, is an English teacher in the Bronx, a single mother of two teenage children, a community activist and frequent speaker to community organizations, and a member of several anti-tax organizations in New York.

About Alfonse D'Amato, the two term Republican incumbent, she says, "Senator Al is typical of what is wrong with Washington and why government under the Republicans and Democrats can not bring spending under control. Operating

according to the rule of take, take, take; Senator Al is proud of his ability to deliver the goods to favored constituents in New York and Puerto Rico right down to the smallest and most expensive pothole.

"Libertarians believe in the principle that taking peoples earnings from them through the force of taxation is wrong. Having been without principle for so long; government, as practiced by the Republicans and Democrats, is now lacking in both discipline and common sense as well."
