The meeting was called to order at 7:06 p.m. by Andrew Kolstee, Chair. Secretary Mark Braiman conducted a roll call and determined that a quorum was present.

A request for public comment by Chair Andrew Kolstee received no comments.

The Credentials and Nominations Report (Exhibit 1) indicated that there were thirty-one (31) of fifty-nine (59) voting members of the State Committee present at the time of roll call. Six (6) later entered the meeting, to give thirty-seven (37) members present out of fifty-nine (59) members of the State Committee after the filling of vacancies. The Secretary determined that a quorum was present at all times during the meeting.

Adoption of the proposed Agenda (Exhibit 2) passed without objection

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of one (1) State Committee vacancy from Judicial District 5. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Chair Andrew Kolstee, hearing no nominations from the floor, postponed filling this vacancy until the next meeting of the State Committee.

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of two (2) State Committee vacancies from Judicial District 6. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Chair

Andrew Kolstee, hearing no nominations from the floor, postponed filling these vacancies until the next meeting of the State Committee.

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of three (3) State Committee vacancies from Judicial District 7. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Chair Andrew Kolstee, hearing no nominations from the floor, postponed filling these vacancies until the next meeting of the State Committee.

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of two (2) State Committee vacancies from Judicial District 10. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Chair Andrew Kolstee, hearing no nominations from the floor, postponed filling these vacancies until the next meeting of the State Committee.

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of two (2) State Committee vacancies from Judicial District 12. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Chair Andrew Kolstee, hearing no nominations from the floor, postponed filling these vacancies until the next meeting of the State Committee.

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of one (1) State Committee vacancy from Judicial District 13. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Chair Andrew Kolstee, hearing no nominations from the floor, postponed filling this vacancy until the next meeting of the State Committee.

Treasurer William Cody Anderson issued a Treasurer's Report in writing (Exhibit 3) and the report was accepted without objection.

Field Development Director Andrew Kolstee issued a report regarding the level of progress by County Affiliates on meeting criteria required for recertification. Motion by Justin Carman to certify that the County Affiliate in Wayne County has met the criteria required in Article 11.2.3. of the Rules of the Libertarian Party of New York was seconded by Sean Phelan and passed without objection.

Motion by Andrew Kolstee on behalf of the Field Development Committee to hold the following hearings to consider revocation of affiliation of County Affiliates for Albany, Chenango, Fulton, Montgomery, Orleans, Otsego, Richmond, Schoharie, and Westchester passed without objection.

A hearing on **revocation of the affiliation of Albany County** was held. Motion by Mark Braiman to **adjourn the hearing of consideration of revocation of Albany County until the first State Committee meeting after the November 7, 2023 election** was seconded by Richard Purtell and there was debate. Mark Braiman stated his reason for proposing the adjournment was that Andrew Kolstee reported Albany County had attempted to hold its convention on March 14, 2023 but had to postpone due to weather. Current Albany County Chair Justin Carr spoke in support of adjourning the hearing, expressing his intention to hold a convention sometime during summer 2022. The original motion for adjournment of the hearing then passed without objection.

A hearing on **revocation of the affiliation of Chenango County** was held. Andrew Kolstee reported that they are not actively holding meetings, and they have not attempted to hold a

convention. Thomas Quiter, the current Chair of Chenango County, has expressed an interest in being appointed County Contact in the event of revocation of affiliation. Motion by Craig Shute to **revoke the affiliation of Chenango County** was seconded by Brian Wells and passed without objection.

A hearing on **revocation of the affiliation of Fulton County** was held. Andrew Kolstee reported that they are meeting regularly, but with insufficient attendance to hold a convention. The most recent attempt to hold a convention was on September 24, 2022. Motion by Chris Olenski to **adjourn the hearing to consider revocation of the affiliation of Fulton County until the first State Committee meeting after the November 7, 2023 election** passed without objection.

A hearing on **the revocation of the affiliation of Montgomery County** was held. Andrew Kolstee reported that their last meeting was in early 2022; they are not actively holding meetings; and they have not attempted to hold a convention. Kolstee reported he had sent several warning emails and messages to the current chair. Motion by Christopher Olenski to **revoke the affiliation of Montgomery County** was seconded by Brian Wells and passed by a vote of 21-3-7. (The detailed report of this and all other polls taken in Porcupine is provided in **Exhibit 4**.)

A hearing on the revocation of **the affiliation of Orleans County was held.** Motion by James Ziobro to **revoke the affiliation of Orleans County** was seconded by Duane Whitmer, and there was discussion. Andrew Kolstee reported that they have not attempted a convention, and that there were four (4) different chairs in 2021-2022 due to a variety of reasons. Current Chair of Orleans County A.J. Butcher attempted to hold Zoom meetings, but other officers have refused to attend them. Others allied with former chair Chase Tkach (also known as Delta Hill, reported to be an erstwhile Republican), attempted to remove A.J. Butcher in an officer group-chat, but without an actual Zoom meeting. Due to this disorderly proceeding and other factors mentioned, Andrew Kolstee recommended that the affiliation be revoked. The original motion to revoke affiliation then passed without objection.

A hearing on the revocation of **the affiliation of Richmond County was held.** Andrew Kolstee recommended to adjourn the hearing until after November 7. Tom Pinkhasov also spoke to the issue, because he was formerly Treasurer and told the Chair Cummings that he would be traveling. He expressed concern that there were no attempts to meet, and expresses concern that an additional 3 or 6 months would not work. Motion by Steven Becker to **adjourn the hearing to consider revocation of the affiliation of Richmond County (Staten Island) until the first State Committee meeting after the November 7, 2023 election was seconded by Sean Phelan and passed 14-10-5.**

A hearing on the revocation of **the affiliation of Schoharie County was held.** Andrew Kolstee reported they attempted a convention on April 8, 2023 but had inadequate attendance. Andrew Kolstee recommended to adjourn the hearing until after November 7. Motion by Steven Becker to **adjourn the hearing to consider revocation of the affiliation of Richmond County** (Staten Island) until the first State Committee meeting after the November 7, 2023 election, was seconded by Sean Phelan, was debated, and passed 20-3-6.

A hearing on the revocation of **the affiliation of Westchester County was held.** Andrew Kolstee reported that there has been no attempted convention and that current Chair William

Schmidt, the only remaining officer, recommends revocation of affiliation so that a new County Contact can be appointed. Motion by Christopher Olenski to **revoke the affiliation of Westchester County** was seconded by Craig Shute and was debated, and then passed without objection.

Rules Committee Chair Andrew Kolstee issued a Report in writing (**Exhibit 5**). Motion by Michael Rebmann on behalf of the Rules Committee to **adopt Proposal 1 (G)** passed without objection. Motion by Justin Carman on behalf of the Rules Committee to adopt **Proposal 2 (H)** passed without objection.

Motion by Chris Olenski on behalf of the Rules Committee to reconsider the vote on **Proposal** 1(G) was seconded by Tom Pinkhasov and was debated, then failed by a vote of 6-20-4. (See **Exhibit 4** for details of the vote).

Motion by Karen Keniry Thompson on behalf of the Rules Committee to **adopt Proposal 3(K)** was debated. Motion by Robert Schuon **to amend to strike the words "...at all times"** was seconded by Mark Braiman and passed without objection. The original motion to **adopt Proposal 3(K) as amended** then passed without further objection.

Motion by Daniel Castello on behalf of the Rules Committee to adopt **Proposal 4(L)** was debated. Motion by Robert Schuon **to refer or commit back to the Rules Committee** failed for lack of a second, and then the original motion passed 18-4-9. (See **Exhibit 4** for details of the vote).

Platform Committee Chair Mark Glogowski issued a report. Motion by Mark Glogowski for the State Committee to put to a vote six (6) different wordings for a platform plank on abortion, allowing the State Committee to choose from among them. A Point of Parliamentary Inquiry was asked by Mark Braiman to clarify whether Glogowski's intention was to carry out approval voting as well as a secret ballot using Porcupine, and whether this would be possible or appropriate. Chair Andrew Kolstee ruled to allow a Porcupine ballot with approval voting, using multiple rounds to determine whether the most popular choice could achieve a majority and could receive more votes than NOTA. Justin Carman objected with a point of order asserting that our Special Rules of Order do not provide for such a voting procedure. Andrew Kolstee stated that the point of order is not well taken. Motion by Justin Carman to challenge the ruling of the Chair was seconded by Michael Rebmann and debated. Motion to uphold the ruling of the Chair failed, 10-18-3. (See Exhibit 4 for details of the vote). Justin Carman objected to the Platform Committee Report being given. Before the Chair issued any ruling on this objection, Mark Glogowski submitted his resignation from the Platform Committee. Motion by Blay Tarnoff to populate the Platform Committee with volunteers. Chair Andrew Kolstee ruled that a formal motion was unnecessary, and instead asked for volunteers for the Platform Committee. Eleven members volunteered, and were appointed to the Platform Committee without objection. Chair Andrew Kolstee stated that he will allow them to select a Platform Committee Chair from among themselves.

Motion by Justin Carman to authorize an additional \$1200 for the licensing of Humanitru, to include porting charges was seconded by Sean Phelan and passed without objection.

Motion by Sean Phelan to **hold a hearing to remove Jeffrey Bradley as a member of the State Committee from Judicial District 7 due to abandonment of position** was seconded by Rob Greibesland. Motion by Duane Whitmer to amend in order to add Erin Becker, so that the motion would read "hold a hearing to remove Jeffrey Bradley as a member of the State Committee from Judicial District 7 and Erin Becker as a member of the State Committee from Judicial District 8, due to abandonment of position." A point of order was raised by Blay Tarnoff, who stated that the LPNY Rules do not allow a hearing for someone who evinces an interest in continuing on the State Committee, and that Erin Becker's presence at the current (6/4/2023) meeting indicated her interest. Chair Kolstee asked Erin Becker whether she has intent to continue on the State Committee. Erin Becker affirmed that she does so intend. Kolstee ruled that the Whitmer amendment was therefore out of order. A motion to **challenge the** ruling of the Chair by Christopher Olenski was seconded by Justin Carman and debated. The motion to sustain (uphold) the Ruling of the Chair passed by a vote of 21-4-2. (Details are provided in Exhibit 4. The total of 21 ayes reported here includes a voice vote by Blay Tarnoff, who stated after the Porcupine poll of 20-4-2 was closed that he had wished to vote ave but was unable to register his vote in the Porcupine poll due to a computer glitch). A point of order was raised by Chris Olenski that the proposed hearing for Jeffrey Bradley's removal is also out of order, since Jeffrey Bradley too had expressed the intent, in a May 30 email, to attend the current (6/4/2023) meeting of the State Committee and therefore to continue his position. The Chair agreed that the point of order was well taken, and ruled that the motion to hold a hearing for Jeffrey Bradley was out of order. A challenge to the ruling of the Chair by Michael Rebmann was seconded by Justin Carman, and debated. The Ruling of the Chair was sustained (upheld) by a vote of 17-3-7. (Details are provided in Exhibit 4. The total of 17 ayes reported here includes Chris Olenski who stated after the Porcupine poll of 16-3-7 was closed that he had wished to vote aye but was unable to register his vote in the Porcupine poll due to a computer glitch)

Motion by Karyn Thompson to **adjourn** was seconded by Robert Schuon and passed 16-1-1. (See **Exhibit 4** for details of the vote).

The meeting was adjourned at 10:49 p.m.

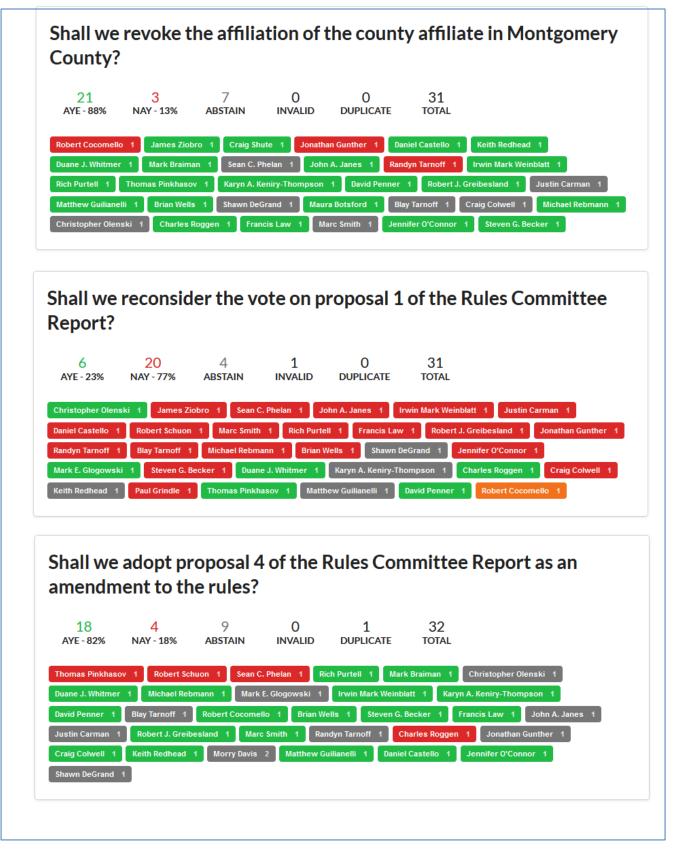
Although our recurring monthly expenses have held steady for some time, the implementation of the Humanitru CRM system will have significant one-time (\$1200) and recurring costs (\$3000/year) that we will need to cover going forward.

In short: monthly revenue must be increased significantly in order to adequately cover both our additional recurring expenses, as well as the unexpected expenses, such as for legal and candidate support, we are certain to incur. I defer to the Finance Director to speak to the ways in which he intends to attain the means we require, and to the Communications Director to speak to progress made on resuming our email outreach, which has traditionally been our best opportunity to energize our base and ask for donations periodically.

REPORT OF THE RULES COMMITTEE FOR THE STATE COMMITTEE MEETING OF JUNE 4, 2023

PROPOSAL 1 (G). This is a legacy provision for meetings held in person (we have a new Article 8.3 for that) and the first sentence on allowing teleconferencing is already mentioned in Article 8.1. Moved the one sentence up and reworded.

8.1. **GENERAL.** Meetings of the State Committee and of the Executive Committee shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions in this article. Meetings shall be held in-person, by electronic means, or a combination thereof, in which case all members shall have the same rights and privileges regardless of means of attending. Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be open to observation by all members of the State Committee and officers of County Affiliates upon request, with the exception of Executive Session. The Organization Meeting and meetings held for the purpose of nominating statewide candidates must be held in person, except as provided in Article 8.3.

8.6. **MEETINGS HELD IN-PERSON.** At in-person meetings of the State Committee, teleconferencing is permitted; teleconferencing members shall have the same rights and privileges as those attending in-person.

PROPOSAL 2 (H). Cleanup all policies on voting. Move Article 8.4.2 up to a new, single article on voting. Moved 7.6 (voting of the Executive Committee) from the previous article and merging them. Moved 6.9 (voting regarding State Committee) and also merging it here. 8.4. **VOTING.**

8.4.1. **VOTING MEMBERS.** The LPNY members elected to the State Committee at the most recent election of the State Committee or elected to fill a vacancy during the term of to the State Committee in accordance with these Rules at the most recent election shall be the voting members, of the Organization Meeting except that only LPNY Members elected to the Executive Committee shall be the voting members at the meeting of that body.

8.4.2. **NUMBER OF VOTES.** 7.6. **VOTING.** Each member of the Executive Committee shall have one vote. 6.9. **VOTING.** In all meetings, each member of the State Committee respective committee shall be entitled to a single non-transferable vote, except on all votes pertaining to the designation, nomination, substitution, or authorization of a candidate for statewide office, each member of the State Committee shall cast the whole number of votes cast for Governor from the Unit of Representation as described in Article 6.3, on the line or column of the Libertarian Party in the last preceding general election for Governor.

8.4.3. MISCELLANEOUS VOTING RULES. [from 7.6] There shall be no proxy voting. Voting on any issue before the Executive Committee may be conducted through electronic means or written ballot. [Renumber after Article 8.4 and Article 6.9 above accordingly]

8.4. ORGANIZATION MEETING. ...

8.4.2. **VOTING MEMBERS.** The members elected to the State Committee in accordance with these Rules at the most recent election shall be the voting members of the Organization Meeting.

10.4. **RECORDS.** All committees shall keep a record of their proceedings. The Secretary shall keep a record of all committees and their membership. The Chairs of all committees must maintain a digital roster of all current committee members, a list of dates meetings were held and the attendance of those meetings, that is accessible at all times to the Chair and Secretary.

PROPOSAL 4. (L). Reorganizing County Contacts section.

11.1.1.2. COUNTY CONTACTS. UNORGANIZED COUNTIES. An unorganized county is In-any county in which where no recognized County Affiliate exists., tThe State Committee may appoint an Acting County Chair and County Representative from among the LPNY Member(s) in that county. one or more enrolled members of the Libertarian Party to serve as County Contacts for the purpose of organizing a County Organization. The State Committee shall also designate by appointment the Lead County Contact, who is responsible for organizing meetings. Upon establishment of a County Organization, the duly elected Chair shall replace the County Contact as the State Committee's primary contact for a given county. Both positions may be held by the same person.

11.2.1. **ACTING COUNTY CHAIR.** The Acting Chair of an unorganized county is responsible for holding a meeting or event no less than twice per quarter and promoting them for the purpose of ultimately organizing a County Affiliate and building a Libertarian Party presence in the county. 11.2.2. **COUNTY LIAISON.** The County Representative of an unorganized county is responsible for serving as the liaison of the unorganized county to the State Committee.

11.1.1.2.3. **TERMS.** County Contacts Acting County Chairs and County Liaisons shall serve until the end of the succeeding calendar quarter, subject to renewal or removal by the State Committee. Each renewal of a County Contact shall expire at the end of the succeeding calendar quarter.
