

# Congressional District Chair Attendance Requirement

**Problem:** In the past some CD chairs have not frequently attended or participated in SCC meetings, leaving the Party members in that district effectively unrepresented.

**Solution:** Automatically remove any CD chair who is absent from three consecutive SCC meetings. Require a CD convention to be called in this circumstance so that Party members in that district are able to choose their new representative.

**Benefits:** Ensures that CD chairs either participate in and represent the Party members in their district or allows the Party members in that district to select a new CD chair who will do so.
