"Following the Science"

A message from Joe Dehn, County Chair:

There are a lot of people in the media who don't seem to understand what "science" actually is about. They seem to think it's whatever answers people called "scientists" give to a wide range of questions, including questions about decisions facing politicians and voters about economic and social issues.

That's *not* what science is. Science is a way of approaching questions about the universe, to build theories/models of how the world works by testing hypotheses through experiments. It is a *process*, not a set of answers. While it is true that the models produced by science can give very useful answers to certain kinds of

practical questions (e.g., if we do this, what is likely to happen?), these answers have some *very important limitations*.

First, all scientific models are subject to reconsideration, as new information becomes available. Second, all scientific models have limited scope, they only apply to certain kinds of things or "when all else is equal". Actual scientists usually understand this but many people (including most professional "media" people) who are only looking at the output produced by a model (numbers, graphs) do *not* understand this.

Finally, and perhaps most important, "science" cannot answer questions involving subjective factors, where different people may want to apply different values in making tradeoffs. Yet both media people and politicians routinely ignore this limitation. They hold up charts that support some particular point that helps their argument, while ignoring – and hoping that you will also ignore – those broader questions. They also make a habit of *failing to follow science themselves*, when the models and data (including almost everything we have learned about economics) cast doubt on the logic of their own favored proposals.

I am personally a big fan of science – actual science. I have been interested in science since I was a small child, and graduated from one of the most famous scientifically-oriented universities in the world. But (and perhaps partly because of that) the sight of people who know almost nothing about science just blindly following the latest pronouncements of anybody on TV wearing a white coat makes me sick.

And knowing that this is how most people are getting most of their information about science, that is why when I hear anybody arguing for any *political position* using phrases like "follow the science", I know that while they may mean well they probably don't know what they are talking about, and generally take it as a clue to pay less attention to whatever they are saying!



Libertarian Registration is Up Statewide

Good news - Libertarian registration in California is at an all time high!

According to the latest report from the Secretary of State, as of 10 February 2021 the number of registered Libertarians statewide reached 204,345. That's up by 8,237 since the last such report, just before the November election. In percentage terms, our count increased more than eight times faster since then (4.20%) than the count of all registered voters (0.48%). Both as an absolute number and as a fraction of all

registered voters, Libertarian registration in California is now higher than it has ever been!



Unfortunately, although Libertarian registration in Santa Clara County also increased over this period, the increase was much smaller, and in terms of the fraction of all registered voters Libertarian registration here is significantly below the state average.

Let's try to change that!

If you are currently registered with some other party, please consider changing your registration to Libertarian. The same if you currently are not registered with any party (officially called "no party preference", formerly called "decline to state"). And please encourage your friends to register Libertarian too!

Imhoff Investigation Committee Update

As long-time readers of this newsletter will recall, back in 2019 two of the officers of our county party were expelled from the Libertarian Party of California by action of the state Executive Committee, without an adequate explanation being presented to the membership at large or even to the members of our own county Executive Committee. This led to many difficulties for us at the county level, as well as much controversy at the state level, including a lot of discussion at last year's state convention both about how to resolve the specific case and how to increase transparency of the state party's actions in future cases.

Now, more than a year and a half since the events which precipitated this case, and more than a year after the last state convention, the LPC Chair has finally announced the appointment of a committee to conduct "a complete investigation of the accusations". In an attempt to ensure that the process will be both thorough and fair, this committee is made up of one member from the state Executive Committee (current LPC Vice Chair Brent Olsen), one member from our county Executive Committee (our Vice Chair Mark Hinkle), and three other LPC members who have no connection with either body (James Aragon, Daniel Hayes, and Kevin Moore).

This committee is to report their findings to both the state Executive Committee and our county Executive Committee.

Libertarian Candidate for Governor?

It appears that the petition for a recall election to replace Gavin Newsom was a success. Although the verification of the signatures is not yet complete, with more than 2,000,000 signatures submitted most activists of all parties are now expecting that a recall election will happen. The date isn't set yet, but it should be some time this fall.



Of course we want to be able to support a Libertarian to replace him! But who will that be? One fairly well-known LP member has indicated he is interested in running, but has not yet officially announced his plans. So it's not a sure thing yet.

Meanwhile we *have* invited him to speak to us at our 10 April meeting – and the same invitation applies to anybody else who is seriously considering running in that election as a Libertarian. If we like what we hear, we will have an opportunity to endorse somebody at that meeting.
