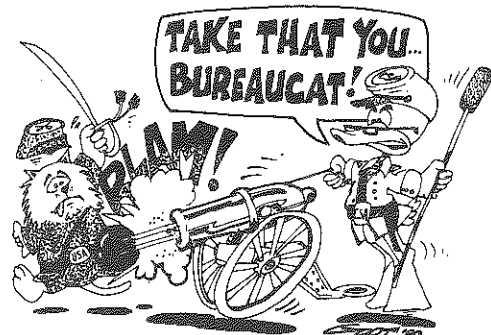

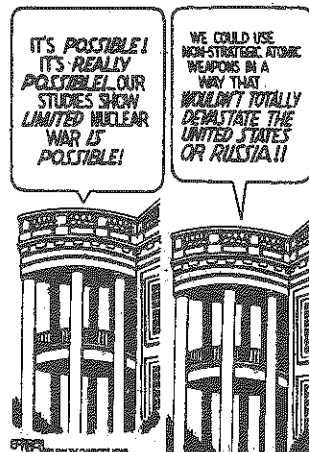

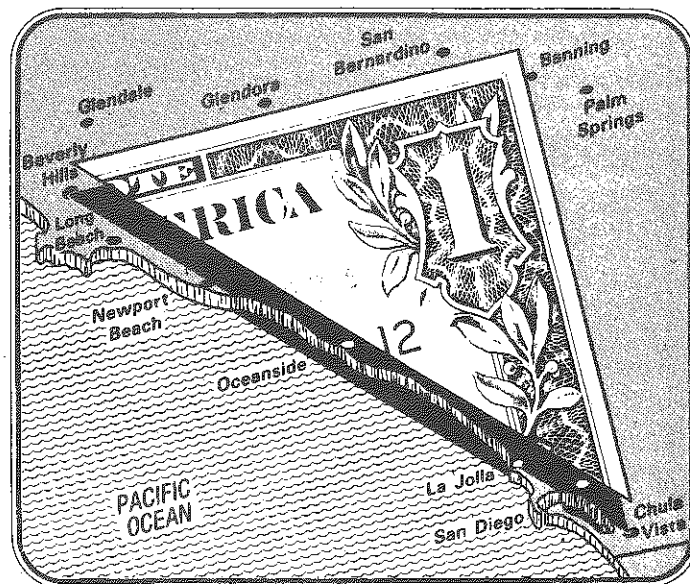
In Rockford, IL Rev. Larry Leathers is in trouble with the local authorities for operating a church in violation of the zoning code. (PPFE)

A ONE-QUESTION REFUTATION OF SLAVERY DEFENDERS

This analysis is about baby talk. It's about the kind of thing that sensible people have to say to foolish people, and the kind of thing that shouldn't have to be said to anyone over the age of seven months.

It is also about slavery, of two kinds: modern Communism, and ancient chattel slavery of the kind practiced in the Antebellum South. The "foolish people" referred to above are the defenders of those two systems; Communism of course has more defenders than the other kind of slavery (that's my worst understatement of the decade; the former simply control the thought-formation realms of American life), but there are still writers, many of them southern, who continue, softly, to argue the beneficence of the old slave system. Writers like myself have spent much of our lives refuting the mixture of lies-and-illogic adduced to defend both systems, but while teaching a university course in political science, I found that the defenses can be demolished with wonderful quickness by asking a single question of each set of defenders (one which reveals the reality of both slave systems).

After you have listened to some zombie expound upon the wonderfulness of life in the people's hell of China, just ask him this: if all that is true, kindly explain to me the one datum which defines all of life in that paradise--the knowledge that anyone interested in leaving has to literally risk his or her life to do so. If all is so splendid, why does the regime spend billions each year on border guards and mines and machine guns and patrol boats to keep its "citizens" in, and why does it, again literally, murder them, not for any alleged "crime," but for the simple act of leaving? The answer of course is too obvious to need elaboration; the slave states (I named China only because along with Albania and North Korea it's marginally more beastial than the others) must do all of that, because all that they say about their system is lies, because their people recognize that, and because their countries would be rapidly depopulated if they were allowed to express that recognition with their feet, by getting out.

And after you've listened to someone's account of how great slavery was for chattels in the Old South, just ask him (or her; men have no monopoly upon mindlessness): If all that is true, why did not the slaveholders of olden days simply give each slave the option of remaining a slave or going free? Why were there slave patrols and bloodhounds and fugitive slave laws and death penalties for helping slaves escape? I need hardly add that the answer is the same as the one noted above.

A word of warning: Do not accept a sophism which runs like this: We can't let them (either group of "them") go, because we've got a lot invested in them. In the case of the South, purchased freedom was generally as forbidden as any other kind; in the Communist slave states, no amount of payment from outside relatives can get the captives out. The issue is not investment, it's that both "defenses" are lies and that the people who are the victims/slaves know it and would opt for freedom if they could. The two slave-systems are identical in dozens of ways, and this one is crucial.

LOOK WHO'S COMING TO THE SODOMY PARTY!

These days, when it is vogue to "come out of the closet" and "let it all hang out", no one should be surprised to see Paul Gann, Eugene McCarthy and all the other formerly-respectable individuals exposing their true moral characters this week by keynoting a public revelry of proclaimed sodomy and pervert-liberation enthusiasts.

The so-called Liberatarians Party — more accurately, the Sodomy Party — is a project of the international organized crime network known as "Dope, Inc.", launched through the Mont Pelerin Society front group of Count Otto Von Hapsburg's neo-Nazi Pan-European Union, the terrorist Institute for Policy Studies (IPS), and MIT linguist/brainwasher Noam Chomsky.

The Sodomy Party is being packaged and delivered to the U.S. population as a "third party alternative" by a three-stage method: 1) building the party's base of activists out of the dregs of the drug-homosexual counterculture, itself a product of IPS, Chomsky, et al, social engineering from the 1960s, 2) flooding the party with heavy funding and organization from select sources, and 3) deploying the petty whores of the controlled media to project the party's image as a clean-cut, viable "third party alternative".

In reality, the Sodomy Party is a by-the-book "Cointelpro" operation of "Dope, Inc." and predominantly British intelligence networks. It's function is to contribute to the election of Trilateral Commission stooges Alexander Haig or John Connally in 1980, primarily by functioning as a dirty-tricks instrument and obstacle to the rapidly-growing American System Presidential campaign of Lyndon H. LaRouche.

For the edification of the credulous, the Sodomy Party projects the image of taking "principled" stands on economic and moral issues, stands which, in fact, are nothing more than linguistic modifications of infantile impulses for uninhibited public masturbation. This party's "principles" are simply the elevation of the most bestial, anti-social impulses in man to the level of the "highest good", in just the way Jeremy Bentham proposed, as a paid agent of the British East India Company, to advocate the mass-murder, drug-pushing policies of the 18th century British Empire.

The core of the Sodomy Party program is the legalization of all drugs — including heroin — and all sex, including pederasty (with children) and bestiality (with animals).

British Cointelpro methods have always been to bring out the worst, most bestial impulses in man. That is how you control him. Make a man a slave to his most irrational desires, and he is a slave to whatever controls the means for even-momentary satisfaction of those desires. This is the formula for rule by tyranny.

The anti-progress, anti-rational ideology of zero-growth is an outgrowth of this slavery, as Bentham's associate Malthus knew. Thus, we have today's "environmentalists", and the Sodomy Party's opposition to nuclear power.

By contrast, the American republic was established and built on the principle of rule by that unique quality which alone distinguishes man from the beasts — the power of reason. Rule by reason is the principle of natural law that underlies our Constitution, and the commitment to progress and morality that it implies is indispensable to the functioning of a democratic republic. Today in America, it is the Presidential campaign of Lyndon H. LaRouche that fully embodies this principle in its six-point program, centered on a commitment to aggressive nuclear power development and to the eradication of mind-destroying drugs.

As for the Sodomy Party, let no one be fooled about its nature, its origins its goals. Anyone who tries to peddle the line that these so-called Libertarians are anything other than a perverse, pro-drug, pro-pederasty instrument of evil minds is an accomplice of that same evil. For you see, these Libertarians like to let it all hang out, except for the truth.

LIBERTARIANISM. Runs from "left" advocacy of total anarchy to "right" conservatism. The one common denominator of all libertarians is the support of free trade, the essential prop of international capitalism. Libertarianism is not a viable political philosophy because it is as unworkable as communism, and can only be accurately described as a secular religion. As with the faithful of all religions, hardly two libertarians agree with each other on all doctrinal points.

SOCIAL SECURITY FACTS

In 1960 the Social Security tax was 3%. It grew to 6.65% by 1981. The wage base grew from \$4800 to \$29,700. The maximum tax paid by an individual grew from \$144 per year to \$1975.05. You can see the burden.

We must remove from the Social Security program all of the welfare-oriented programs which were added during the heyday of the Great Society in the 1960's. The Social Security system should be for one thing only. It should provide retirement security income for those who have worked and paid into the system—nobody else. Unfortunately, programs ranging from Aid to Dependent Children to those helping illegal aliens come out of the same Social Security system. All of these should be removed and transferred to the General Fund. This would be the first step toward the goal of making the fund solvent while not increasing the burden on our productive, working Americans who have had more and more taxes heaped on their backs.

We should not jeopardize the benefit programs for those Americans who have paid their share in Social Security taxes and have a right to expect that when they retire the insurance benefits will be there.

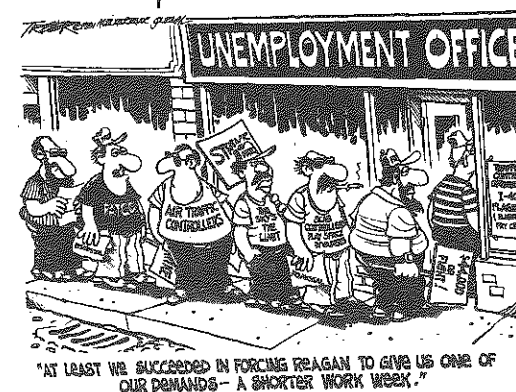

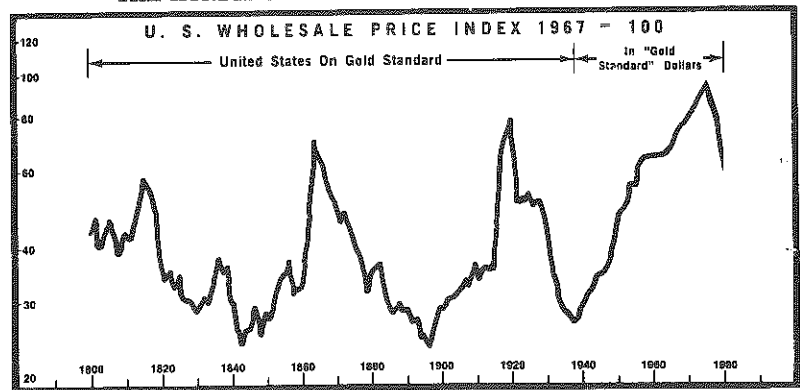
