Clarification: Last Entry-Mark-Up Legend: RONR Tinted Page 8, No. 13. Amend Something Previously adopted, general case, including ordinary standing rules, vote required Majority with Notice, 2/3 or Majority of Entire Membership.

LATHAM: Like to focus on second issue, None of the Above. Move to add h.

HARLOS: Original only goes to g. In R.2. you added h. None of the above shall be treated as any other candidate.

DEBATE AS TO ADDING h.

HARLOS: Is there any objection to this amendment? (No Response). ADOPTED WITHOUT OBJECTION. **(29:41)** Moving to R.3. backwards tie breaking.

e. In the event of a tie in any round which makes a difference in which candidate advances, ties shall be broken by retaining the candidate that had the most votes in the prior round and if still a tie, then the most votes in the round before that and so on. If this method results in a tie up through the current round, the tie shall be broken randomly.

HARLOS: Deciding between forward and backward tie breaking. A Yes Vote makes it backwards tie breaking. A No Vote will leave it as forward tie breaking.
